The said Joseph Beeten is about Five Feet Nine or Ten Inches high, slender and genteel in his Person, about Twenty Years of Age, of a fair Complexion, wears his own Hair loose, which is of a light brown Colour, is a Native of Lynn, and brought up to the Business of a Sail-maker. When he escaped he was dressed in a light coloured Coat, broad blue striped Waistcoat, lapped, Nankern Breeches, white Stockings, and a flapped Hat.

Whoever will apprehend the said Joseph Beeten, and secure him in any of His Majesty's Goals in this Kingdom, shall receive a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS.
