Petersburg, December 3. HEIR Imperial Highneffes the Great Duke and Duchels arrived at the Palace of this Capital, on Sunday Evening at Six o'Clock, in prfect Health, after an Absence of upwards of a Twelvemonth.

P R Е SE N Т, The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. W Hereas His Majefty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 21lt Day of June last, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby dirccted, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the rige of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 30th Day of September then following, voluntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majefty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And that a Bounty of Thirty Shillings fhould be paid to every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-ave, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who fhould voluntarily enter themselves as aforefaid, to ferve on Board any of His Majefty's Ships: And that a Reward of I'wo Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to any Perfon who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfeives, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen flould be taken for His Majefty's faid Eervice: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this inant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majelly's Service that the laid Bounties and R wards thould be continued to be paid for tome Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Pavment of the faid Bounties and Rowards be proloaged and extended from the 31ft Day of this infant December, to the 31ft Day or March next, in-clufive. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take. Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

The KING's Moit Excellent Majefty in Council. THEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 19th of June last, for continuing the Prohibition on the Exportation or Carrying of Copper Coastwife, (except as therein mentioned) will expire on the 22d of this inftant December : And whereas His Majefly

critical Conjuncture, that the Exportation of Carrying Copper Coastwife, should continue to be prohibited for some Time longer, excert under the Refirictions and Conditions hereinafter mentioned : His Majesty is thereupon pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Prohibition upon the Exportation or Carrying of Copper Coastwife be continued for Six Months, to commence from the 22d Day of this inflant December; but it is His Majefty's Pleasure that the same shall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper to be exported or fent Coaftwife by the Commiffioners of His Majery's Navy, or their Officers or Agents, for His Ma-jetty's Service; or to the carrying Coaffwife or exporting of Copper in Sheets, veighing leis than exporting of Copper in Sheets, weighing leis than Twelve and more than Forty Ounces to the Foot tuperficial, to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which the fame may be lawfully exported; upon Con-dition, that all fuch Copper be infpected and exa-mined by an Agent or Agents appointed or to be appointed by the Commifficiences of His Ma-jefty's Navy; and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent or Agents, fluil be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of fuch Copper confilts of Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefs than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot fuperficial; which Certificate from the to the Foot superficial; which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cultoms at the Port in which the faid Copper is intended to be fhipped, and fhall be their Authority for allowing the Quantity of Copper specified in the faid Certificate to be put on Board, in order to be carried Coaftwife or exported: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to permit and allow the Experiation of Copper in Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefs than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot superficial, provided that the fame shall confist of Pieces not exceeding Four Pounds Weight in any One Piece; and that a Certificate thereof be obtained in Manner above directed, before such Copper be laden or put on Board ; and also to permit the carrying Coasswife of Copper in Sheets weighing more than Twelve Ounces and lefs than Forty Ounces inclusive to the Foot superficial, upon Condition that no more than Five Hundred Weight of fuch Copper shall be shipt by any one Person or Partnership, and that the Quantity put on Board any one Ship or Vess-1 shall not exceed Ten Hundred Weight in the Whole, unless Security by Bond hath fill been given to the proper Odicers of His Majefty's Cuitoms, in Treble the Value of fuch. Copper, to carry the fame to the Places propoled, and none other; and to produce and deliver a Certificate or Certificates, within Two Months from the Date of the Ba d, from the proper Officers of the Cuttoms at the Pa te for which any fuch Copper shall be entered and cleared out, of the same having been all duly landed at fuch Ports ; which Certificate or Certificates fuch Officer is hereby required to give ; and the fame Certificate or Certificates the Commissioners of the Customs are hereby required to transmit to the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, in order to be laid before this Board. And the Lords Commiffioners of His judges it necessary for the Publick Good, at this Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing
