THE King having signified His Pleasure to my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that the Uniform Clothing at present worn by the Flag Officers of His Majesty's Fleet, shall be altered in the Manner mentioned at the Foot hereof; and that Commodores having Captains under them, the First Captain to the Admiral of the Fleet, and First Captains to Admirals commanding in Chief Squadrons of Twenty Sail of the Line or more, shall be distinguished by wearing the same Frock Uniform as Rear-Admirals: Their Lordships do hereby give Notice thereof to all Flag Officers; Commodores having Captains under them; and First Captains to the Admirals abovementioned; and require and direct them to conform strictly thereto.

Such Flag Officers, however, as are provided with the Uniforms in present Use, are permitted to wear the same, if they think fit, till the End of the present Year.
