**T**HIS Day his Grace the Duke of Rutland had the Honour to kiss the King's Hand, on being appointed Lord Steward of His Majesty's Household.

**T**HIS Day his Grace Charles Duke of Rutland, Lord Steward of His Majesty's Household, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

**A**T the Court at St. James's, the 14th of February, 1783,

**W**HEREAS John Earley, Yeoman, Joseph Earley, Yeoman, a Person known by the Name of George, otherwise Teapot, Labourer, Peter Warne, Yeoman, and John Nickland, Labourer, all of the Parish of Ringwood in the County of Southampton, and John Streeter, of the Parish of Christchurch in the said County, Mariner, and Esau Shelley, of the Vill of Bilton Closes, in the said County, Yeoman, were, upon the Eighteenth Day of January last past, charged by Information of Six credible Persons, upon Oath by them subscribed, before Henry Compton, Esquire, One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said County of Southampton, with having been guilty, on Thursday the Ninth Day of the said Month of January, of being, with several other Persons to the Number of about Fifty more, armed with offensive Weapons, namely, large Bludgeons and Clubs, and so armed, being assembled together at Burley in the said Parish of Ringwood and County aforesaid, in order to rescue, and to be aiding and assisting in rescuing and taking away a large Quantity of Uncustomed Goods, after Seizure thereof: And whereas Samuel Waters, Labourer, William Skeard, Labourer, Henry White, Labourer, William Bell, Labourer, and William Butler, alias Junper, Labourer, all of the Parish of Ringwood aforesaid, and John Cooper, of the Parish of Christchurch aforesaid, in the County aforesaid, were, upon the said Eighteenth Day of January last, charged by Information of Two credible Persons upon Oath, by them subscribed, before the said Henry Compton, with having been guilty, on the said Ninth Day of January last, of being Part

of the said Number of other Persons, and of being armed with offensive Weapons, namely, large Bludgeons and Clubs, and so armed, being assembled together at Burley aforesaid, in the Parish and County aforesaid, in order to rescue, and to be aiding and assisting in rescuing and taking away the said Uncustomed Goods, after Seizure thereof: Which Information was afterwards by the said Henry Compton certified under his Hand and Seal, and returned to One of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the same before His Majesty in His Privy Council, pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, in that Case made and provided:— His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, Require and Command, that the said John Earley, Joseph Earley, a Person known by the Name of George, otherwise Teapot, Peter Warne, John Nickland, John Streeter, Esau Shelley, Samuel Waters, William Skeard, Henry White, William Bell, William Butler, alias Junper, and John Cooper, and each of them, do surrender himself and themselves, within the Space of Forty Days after the First Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Justice or One other of His Majesty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, or to One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.
