HIS Day his Grace Charles Duke of Rutland, Lord Steward of His Majefty's Houfe hold, was, by His Majefty's Command, (worn of His Majefty's Moft Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

WHEREAS John Earley, Yeoman, Jofeph Earley, Yeoman, a Perfon known by the Name of George, otherwife Teapot, Labourer, Peter Warne, Yeoman, and John Nickland, Labourer, all of the Parifh of Ringwood in the County of Southampton, and John Streeter, of the Parifh of Chritchurch in the faid County, Mariner, and Efau Shelley, of the Vill of Bifton Clofes, in the Maid County, Yeoman, were, upon the Eighteenth Day of January now laft paft, charged by Information of Six credible Perfons, upon Oath by them fubfcribed, before Henry Compton, Efquire, One of His Majefty's Jufices of the Peace in and for the faid County of Southampton, with having been guilty, on Thurfday the Ninth Day of the faid Month of January, of being, with feveral other Perfons to the Number of about Fifty more, armed with offenfive Weapons, namely, large Bludgeons and Clubs, and fo armed, being affembled together at Burley in the faid Parifh of Ringwood and County aforefaid, in order to refcue, and to be aiding and affifting in refcuing and taking away a large Quantity of Uncuftumed Goods, after Seizure thereof: And whereas Samuel Waters, Labourer, William Skeard, Labourer, Henry White, Labourer, William Bell, Labourer, and William Butler, alias Junper, Labourer, all of the Parifh of Ringwood aforefaid, and John Cooper, of the Parifh of Chriftchurch aforefaid, in the County aforefaid, were, upon the faid Eighteenth Day of January laft, charged by Information of Two credible Perfons upon Oath, by them ubfcribed, before the faid Henry Compton, with having been guilty, on the faid Ninth Day of January laft, of being Part

of the faid Number of other Perfons, and of being armed with offenfive Weapons, namely, large Bludgeons and Clubs, and to armed, being affembled together at Burley aforefaid, in the Pa-rish and County aforefaid, in order to refcue, and to be aiding and affifting in refcuing and taking away the faid Uncuftomed Goods, after Seizure thereof: Which Information was afterwards by the faid Henry Compton certified under his Hand and Seal, and returned to One of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the fame before His Majefty in His Privy Council, purfuant to the Act of Par-liament of the Nineteenth Year of His late Majefty King George the Second, in that Cafe made and provided : — His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, Require and Command, that the faid John Earley, Joseph Earley, a Person known by the Name of George, otherwife Teapot, Peter Warne, John Nickland, John Streeter, Efau Shelley, Samuel Waters, William Skeard, Henry White, William Bell, William Butler, alias Junper, and John Cooper, and each of them, do furrender himself and themselves, within the Space of Forty Days after the First Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Juffice or One other of His Majefty's Juffices of the Court of King's Bench, or to One of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace.
