**W**E, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Sheriffs, Citizens, and Commonalty of the City of Norwich, in Common Council assembled, happy in every Opportunity of shewing our Gratitude to your Majesty for your Paternal Concern for the Interests of your People, beg Leave to express our Thanks to your Majesty for your Royal Goodness in complying with the Petitions of your faithful Subjects, by relieving them from an unhappy and disastrous War, and restoring to them the inestimable Blessings of Peace.

The Feelings of those Distresses, brought by the War upon this ancient commercial City, we now suppress, exulting in the Hope and confident Expectation, that together with Peace the Blessings of a flourishing Trade and Commerce will be again restored.

May your Majesty long enjoy the greatest of all Satisfaction to a British Monarch, the seeing his Kingdoms prosperous, his Subjects happy, and himself and his Family beloved by a free, generous and grateful People.
