Muß Gracious Sovereign, Y E, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor and Commonalty of the City of New Sarum, in Common Council affembled, with all Humility acknowledge your Majelly's Wifdom and Goodnefs in putting an End to a ruinous and defructive War, and reftoring to the Nation the Bleffings of Peace.

Your Majefly, during the whole Courfe of your Reign, has demonstrated that you have had no In-terests separate from your People; and the Regard you have gracioully thewn by your Endeavours to lighten the Burthen of the National Expences, is fuch a Mark of your Majefly's tender and affectionare Concern for the Welfare of your Subjects, that we fha'l on all Occasions express our Gratitude.

We beg Leave to affure your Majelly, that not thing that be wanting on our Part to convince the World, that with unfhaken Zeal and Loyalty we. fhall confiarthy endeavour to fupport your Ma-jefty's Royal Perfon, Crown, and Dignity, on which our own Safety and Happiness fo much depend.

Given under the Common Seal of our Corporation, this Seventeenth Day of March, in the Twenty-third Year of your Majesty's Reign.
