Whitehall, March 13, 1783.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in consequence of an Information of Fifteen Hundred Casks of smuggled Spirits being harboured in certain Warehouses at Deal, some Officers of Excise proceeded to that Place, attended by a Detachment of about Forty-seven of His Majesty's Troops, under the Command of Captain Pennymann: That, on their Arrival at Deal, about Nine o'Clock in the Evening of the Eighth Day of February last, they found Intelligence had been previously given of their Approach, the Smuglers being prepared to receive them; and they had not been there many Minutes before they were fired upon apparently by a Body of Persons in one Place, and afterwards from Windows and behind Walls; and that the Troops were prevented from advancing by Ropes drawn across the Street: That, having opened the Door of One Storehouse, a Quantity of Brandy, Geneva, and Raw Coffee was seized; the Smuglers continuing to fire on the Revenue Officers and Troops; they retired with what they had seized.

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Outrage, is hereby pleased to promise His Most Gracious Pardon to any Person or Persons (except those who actually fired upon His Majesty's Troops, or the Revenue Officers) who shall discover any one or more of his or their Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
