A F O R G E R Y.

WHEREAS William Wynne Ryland stands charged before the Right Hon. the Lord Mayor, on Suspicion of feloniously and falsely making, forging and counterfeiting an Acceptance to two Bills of Exchange, for Payment of 7114l. and for publishing the same as true, well knowing them to have been so falsely made and counterfeited, with Intent to cheat and defraud the United East-India Company.

He is about Fifty Years of age, about Five Feet Nine Inches high, wears a Wig, with a Club or Cue, and his own Hair turned over in Front; a black Complexion, thin Face, with strong Lines; his common Countenance very grave, but whilst he speaks rather smiling, and shows his Teeth, and has great Affability in his Manner.
