Venice, OATob. 3: The Letiers we receive from Vieras fufficiently affure us, that the War is begun beE ween the Mofcovites and the Turks, though the Letters we receivefrop Conftantinotle make not any mention thereof, but gn the contrary fay, that People there were enterrained with appearances of accommodating the maters in difference between the two Nations. This weetwarrived here a Veffel from Sicily, it brought litrle News, the French not having made any attemipt either upon Catansa or Siracufa.

Genoua, oftob. 6. The 30 palt arived here the $C$ ontinuation, William Betts Malter, from Puglis; and the firft inflant the Brifold brigat, Henry Greeshil Commander, from Barcelona; and the fohn and Elizabeth, Robert Elfreth from Trapany. The 4 th the Kazberike, Daniel Tracy, from Ralermo; and yefteiday the Friend, Riclard Pidgeon Mafter, from Leverpool in Englanil. Tre four Frencb Gallies who Cruife upon thefe Coatts, returaed hither abour fiv dayes fince, and yeflerday put to Sea again. Some Spanih Barks fitted out at Trapany, meeting not far from $M e f$ fina with the Pbozaix, ¥obs Stallard Mafter, bound hither with Corn from Taranta, carried her in to Siracufap having ulid Torments to make the Mafter and Men fay they were botund to A'effina, though they were palt it when the faid Bałts met the faid Veffel, and have made Prize of the Corn. We have adyice that the French Fleet is returned to Melfina.
 of the Imperial Army, who wẹre wounded in the Acti, on ori the $7^{\text {th }}$ inftane, are fince dead at Strasburg, whithet they were carried, to be beteer look'd after than they could be in the Army. We are affured that the Imperiatijfs had goo Men killed or wounded in that Engagements, The Armies continue in the Field, bur the Cavalry oh both fides begin very much to fuffer for want of Eoraty, fo that they will be neceffrated to decamp in fewdayes. We ale told that the Count de Rabata is dippointed to command a Flying Body of 6000 Men, compofed of the Troops of the Elector Patatine, the Elettor of Meniz, and the Landgrave of Heffo, and of a detactment of the Imperial Army. Wep are told that the Tmperialifts pretend to defend sarbruck, and the other Caftes thécy have upon the Saar, and to fortifie, themitives there.

Pariza, 0 Citob. 20. The laft Letrers we received from Alfoce, gave anatconnt that the Duke of Lorraix begin to retire, in ordec to the puting his Troops into winter-quarters, the Cavalry fuffeking very much for want of Fornge; the Marefchyl' de Crequis, we hear, is likewife preparing to go into Wintef-quarters, and he himplelf is expeded here ere long. In Flamdersthe Kings Musketeers, and fome other Companies of the Kings Houfhold, are gone re their Winter-quarters, which makes us believe the Aymies in thofe Parts will very fuddenly Feparate. Ycherday was beheaded on the Greue a Genclewémanr of Normandy, for havisp counterfeited Letters, which fecamedro difcover a Correfpondence between the Governor of Maxurdy, and the Enemy, with defign not only to bave deprived that Gentleman of his Gavernment, but of his Life likewife. The King has this week difpofed of feveral Bilhopricks, and amoing others that of $\underset{\text { st. Omer, which is given to the }}{ }$ Abbeak suze.
Ditto, ©CEb. 23. The King has appointed the Winter-quarters fof his Troops, 'andy sheOfficers that are to command theré. The Marquis de, la Troxfe Lieutenant General, will cemmand chofe that are at Dankirk, Bergue, Graveline, Calais, Baarbourgiand other plakes ot the Sea Coaft.
