WH, your Majesty's moſt dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, and Capital Burgeſſes, of your Town of Beverley in the County of York, with great Humility approach your Throne, and beg your Royal Permiſſion to expreſs our warmeſt Sentiments of Gratitude and Congratulation for the humane and juſt Measures your Majesty has purſued, in terminating a long and expenſive War, and reſtoring to your Subjects the Bleſſings of Peace, Happy in the Experience of your Majesty's Paternal Care of the Interests of your People, we look forward, with a well-grounded Confidence, to thoſe various and important National Advantages that may be expected to flow from ſo auſpicious an Event; the Eſtabliſhment and Duration of the Trade, the Welfare and Proſperity of the British Dominions. It is our moſt ſincere and ardent Wiſh, that your Majesty may long enjoy the grateful Returns of a faithful and affectionate People, and every Proof of their inviolable Attachment to your Majesty's Perſon, Family, and Government.
