HE King has been pleafed to grant to John Courtney, Efq; the Office of Mafter Surveyor of the Ordnance:

And to Humphry Minchin, Efq; the Office of Clerk of the Ordnance.

The King has been pleafed to grant to Richard Bagot, of Caftle Rifing in the County of Norfolk, Efq; (who is lately married to the Honourable Frances Howard, Sifter of Henry late Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire, deceased) and his Islue, His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname, and bear the Arms of Howard, as borne by the faid late Earl, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and alfo to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The King has been pleafed to grant to Charles Snell, of Auftin Friers, London, Merchant, (purfuant to the Will of his Grandfather Charles Chauncy, late of Newington in the County of Middlefex, Gentleman, deceafed) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname, and bear the Arms of Chauncy, in Addition to his own Name and Arms, fuch Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and alfo to order that this His Majefty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Stockholm, March 24. Yesterday died his Royal Highness Charles Gustavus, youngest Son of the King of Sweden.

Carlfrub, April 12. A few Days fince died her Serene Highne's the Prince's Louifa Carolina, Margravine of Baden Dourlach, and Sifter to the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt.

Portici, April 1. A flight Shock of an Earthquake was felt here, and at Naples, on Friday laft; and we hear from Calabria and Messina, that the Earthquakes still continue in those Parts.

Yesterday a French Frigate and a Corvette arrived at Naples, with Provisions and other Articles, which will be acceptable in Calabria, and which are offered to his Sicilian Majefty by the Most Christian King. The Grand Master of Malta, foon after the first Shock of the Earthquake, fent his Gallies to Messina with Succours, which were at that Moment of infinite Service. At prefent there is no Want of Provisions either in Calabria or at Messina, this Government having greatly exerted itself on that melancholy Oc-

cafion; and his Sicilian Majefty having allotted a very confiderable Sum of Moncy (Four Hundred Thoufand Ducats) for the immediate Relief of the unhappy Sufferers.
