The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 16th of February, 1781, to direct, That all Ships and Veffels then arrived, or that might thereafter arrive, from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania, or from any other Port or Place in Courland, Samogitia, or Livonia, should be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, be permitted to uncharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening, and airing, and with-out performing any Quarantine, provided they fhould have no Goods or Merchandize on Board, the Produce of Turkey or the Levant, which might fubject them to the Rules of Quarantine, under the Directions contained in His Majefty's Order in Council bearing Date the zoth of September then late: that they brought with them clean Bills of last; that they brought with them clean Bills of Health ; and that the Master or other Person taking Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel did first make Oath before the Cultom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate, on their Arrival at the Place where they were bound to, that the Crews were free from all Infection : And whereas it has been reprefented to His Majelly at this Board, that feveral Ships and Veffels are expected to arrive from the faid Ports and Places without Bills of Health, and will thereby become subject to the Rules of Quarantine, to the great Lofs and Detriment of the Owners; His Majefty, taking the fame into Confideration, is pleafed, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that all Ships and Vessels arriving form any of the faid Ports or Places be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening, and airing, and with-out performing any Quarantine, notwithstanding they shall omit to bring a clean Bill of Health; provided they have no Goods or Merchandize on Board the Produce of Turkey or the Levant.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of

Partici, April 8. By the last Accounts from Calabria Ultra and Meffina, it appears, that the Earthquake, flightly felt here and at Naples the 28th of last Month, had been very severe in those Parts, and at the fame Hour; most of the Houses in Ca-lanzaro, Cosenza, and several other Towns in Calabria, which had till then escaped, having been thrown down. The Mortality, however, was not great, as the Inhabitants of the Countries afflicted by the Earthquakes have for fome Time paft quitted their Houfes, and lived chiefly in Tents or Huts.
