"The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS, by an Act of Parliament paffed this Seffion, intituled, "An Act " for preventing certain Inftruments "from being required from Ships be-" longing to the United States of America, and to 5 ° give to His Majesty, for a limited Time, certain " Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Com-merce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Do-"minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United "States," it is, amongft other Things, enacted, That during the Continuance of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to give fuch Directions and to make fuch Regulations with respect to Duties, Drawbacks or otherwife, for carrying on the Trade and Com-merce between the People and Territories belonging 'to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the faid United States, as to His-Majefty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Law, Ulage or Cultom to the contrary notwithflanding: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and direct, That any Oil, or any unmanufac-tured Goods or Merchandizes, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Or-der) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or Ame-rican Ships, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in and belonging to the faid United States, or any of them; and fuch Goods or Merchandize shall and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the like Sort of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects in British Ships from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, notwithstanding such Goods or Merchan-dize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law : And it is hereby further ordered and directed, That schere shall be the same Drawbacks, Exemptions, and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain into the Territories of the faid United States of America, or any of them, as are allowed upon the Exportation of the like Goods or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plantations, or Colonies belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America. And it is hereby farther ordered and di rected, That all American Ships and Veffels which shall have voluntarily come into any Port of Great Britain fince the 20th of January, 1783, shall be ad mitted to an Entry, and, after fuch Entry made, anall be intitled, together with the Goods and Merchandizes on Board the fame Ships and Veffels, to the full Benefit of this Order.-And the Right. Honourable the Lords Commiffioners of His Ma-. jetty's Treafury, and the Lords Commissioners of
