W E, your Majelty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, beg Leave to address your Majefty with Hearts full of Affection and Attachment, and with the most grateful Senfe of your Majelty's Paternal Goodness, in having purlued Measures, by which, under God, we now enjoy the ineftimable Bleffing of Peace: A Bleffing at all Times defireable, but especially at a Time when this Country, pressed by a power-ful Confederacy of its inveterate Enemies, united with its former Subjects and old Allies, was also afflicted with an uncommon Degree of Scarcity of Provisions.

At the End of a War lefs fuccefsful than former Wars have been, we confider outfelves as specially called up by the Providence of God to exert ourfelves in the Difcharge of our Duty, and to culti-vate in the Minds of the People committed to our Care those Sentiments of Religion and Virtue, which form the Hearts of Men to that Righteoufnefs which exalteth a Nation.

We are happy in being able to affure your Majefty of the unaltered Affection of the People of this Part of the United Kingdom to your Majerty's Person and Goverment, and of their Zeal for your Illustrious Family, under whose mild Administration they have to long enjoyed the Bleffings of Civil and Religious Liberty.

That Almighty God, the King of Kings, -and the Ruler of all the Nations of Men, may continually have your Majesty under His Divine Pro-testion; that He may blefs you in your Perfon and in your Family; that He may reward your Majefty's private Virtues with domeflick Felicity, and your mild Government with the Love and Fidelity of your Subjects; that your Reign may be long, happy and prosperous, and that at last your Majelly may, through Jesus Christ our Lord, receive a Crown of Glory, are the earnest Prayers of,
