A P R O C L A M A T I O N, For Pardoning Deferters from the Land Forces. G E O R G E R.

HEREAS divers Perfons duly inlisted, or in Pay as Soldiers in certain Regiments and Military Corps, which have been fince dilbanded or difembodied, and in other Regiments or Corps now fubfilling, have deferted Our Service, and thereby incurred the Penalties respectively inflicted for such Offence, by feveral Acts of Parliament paffed for punishing Mutiny and Defertion : And whereas We are graciously disposed to extend Our Royal Mercy to the faid Offenders, who may be hereafter uleful to their Country in following their honeft and lawful Occupations, in cafe they are enabled thereto by receiving Our free Pardon; We have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation ; and We do hereby, for Us, Our Heirs and Succeffors, pardon and remit all and every fuch Offence and Offences of Defertion from any fuch Regiments or Military Corps, committed by any Perfor or Perfons, previous to the Date of this Our Royal Proclamation: And We do allo release and discharge the faid Offenders from all Profecutions, Imprisonments, and Penalties, commenced or incurred for or by Reafon of any fuch Offence or Offences. And whereas many of the faid Deferters have been apprehended at various Times, and committed for fate Cuitody to the feveral Gaols or Prifons belonging to the Counties, Towns, or Places, where fuch Deferters have been found or apprehended, to the End that they might be proceeded againfl according to Law; the Names of which Deferters have been from Time to Time transmitted to Our Secretary at War for the Time being, pursuant to the Provisions of fuch Acts of Parliament made for punishing Mutiny and Defertion as aforefaid; We do hereby, by and with the Advice of Our faid Privy Council, declare Our farther Pleasure, and do will and re-quire all and every Gaoler and Gaolers, Keeper and Keepers of any Gaol, Houfe of Correction, or Prifon, where any fuch-Deferter or Deferters is or are in Caftody, to difcharge him or them forthwith, without Fee or Reward, upon receiving a Certificate or Certificates, under the Hand of Our Secretary at War for the Time being, that the Name or Names of fuch Deferter or Deferters do appear to him to have been transmitted to the War Office, purfuant to the Provisions of any of the faid Acts : And We do hereby further charge and command every fuch Gaoler or Keeper, within the Space of Seven Days after receiving any fuch Certificate as aforefaid, to make a Return to Our Secretary at War for the Time being, of what fuch Goaler or Keeper fhall have done in pursuance of fuch Certificate, and of this Our Royal Proclamation. Provided always, That nothing herein contained shall extend to difcharge any Perfon or Perfons to in Cuttody for any fuch Offence of Defertion, who thall have been law-

fully committed or detained in the Cuftody of any fuch Gaoler or Keeper for any Crime, Caufe, or Matter, other than fuch Offence or Offences of Defertion.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament paffed this Sellion, intituled, "An Act for preven--" ing certain Inftruments from being required from "Ships belonging to the United States of America, " and to give to His Majefty, for a limited Time, " certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade " and Conmerce between the Subjects of His Majetty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the faid "United States," it is amongh other Things enacted, That during the Continuance of the faid Act, it fhall and may be lawful for His Majelly in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to give fuch Directions and to make fuch Regulations with respect to Duties, Drawbacka or otherwife, for carrying on the Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the faid United States, as to His Majefty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Law, Ufage or Cuftom to the contrary notwithitanding; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and direct, That Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Mailts, Yards, and Bowsprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of Ame-rica, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Ships, by British Subjects or by any of the People inhabiting in and belonging to the faid United States or any of them ; and that the Articles above recited shall and may be entered and landed in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the fame are or may be fubject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects in British Ships from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, not-withstanding fuch Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Masts, Yards, and Bowsprits, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law: And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed, by and with the Advice aforefaid, to order and direct, That any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may likewife (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner above mentioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom, and upon the Importer Paying

paying down in ready Money the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, fuch Tobacco may be warehoused under His Majesty's Locks, upon the Im-porter's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco within the Time limited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Tobacco at the Time it shall be fo landed. with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Reftrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as fuch Tobacco is and may be warchoufed by virtue of any Act or Acts of Parlia-ment in Force.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
