Westminster, July 15.

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by Robert Quarme, Esq; Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, the Duke of Portland, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to enable His Majesty to raise a further Sum of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, to pay off and discharge the Debts due and owing on the Civil List.

An Act for repealing so much of an Act made in the Twenty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, as took off the Duties payable upon the Importation of that Species of Blue called Smalts, and for granting Relief to the Owners or Proprietors of Tobacco of the Growth of that Part of Great Britain called Scotland, which shall not be worth the Duties imposed thereon by an Act of the last Session of Parliament.

An Act for granting Relief to the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, by allowing further Time for the Payment of certain Sums due and to become due to the Public, and by advancing to the said Company, on the Terms therein mentioned, a certain Sum of Money to be raised by Loans or Exchequer Bills; and to enable the said Company to make a Dividend of Four Pounds per Centum to the Proprietors at Christmas, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-three; and to regulate the future Payment of Debentures of Drawbacks on East India Goods.

An Act for altering the Duties and Drawbacks upon plain Muslins, unrated Muslins and Callicoes, and Narquin Cloths.

An Act for appointing Commissioners to enquire into the Losses and Services of all such Persons who have suffered in their Rights, Properties and Professions, during the late unhappy Dissensions in America, in consequence of their Loyalty to His Majesty, and Attachment to the British Government.

An Act for the more effectual Encouragement of the Manufactures of Flax and Cotton in Great Britain.

An Act for the better preventing Frauds in the landing and removing of Wine in this Kingdom, and to prevent the relanding of refined Sugars entered for Exportation to obtain the Drawback or Bounty.

An Act for preventing the Exportation of Corn, Grain, or Meal, with a Bounty, during the Operation of Two Acts passed in this present Session of Parliament, for allowing the Importation of Corn.

An Act for the further encouraging the Growth of Coffee and Cocoa Nuts in His Majesty's Islands and Plantations in America.
