HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House Commons by Robert Quarme, Esq; Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Viriue of His Majes, y's Commission, for declaring His Royal As-Jent to several Asts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission; impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord President of the Council, the Lord Privy Seal, the Duke of Portland, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act to enable His Majesty to raise a surther Sam of Money by Loans or Exchequer Bills, to pay off and discharge the Debts due and owing on the Ci-

An Act for the better preventing Frauds in the landing and removing of Wine in this Kingdom, and to prevent the relanding of refined Sugars entered for Exportation to obtain the Drawback or Bounty.

An Ast for preventing the Exportation of Corn, Grain, or Meal, with a Bounty, during the Operation of Two Asts passed in this present Session of Parliament, for allowing the Importation of Corn.

An Ad for the further encouraging the Growth of Coffee and Cocoa Nuts in His Majesty's Islands and

Plantations in America.
