Our Armies continue encamped as we rold you in our latt, though it's fai, for cer ain that they will b eak up on Monday or Tuefday next, by which rime the latt Cenvoy that wis fent to Namur will be returned. In the interim feveral Troop, have been fent from the Army to their Winter qu rrers. Major General webbenum is marched with a confi erable Bowy towards $H_{a} f f e l t$, and it's $f_{1}$ id $i_{s}$ appoinced to command the Confederate Troops that were pethed this Summer about Nueftricht, and are now oilferted into Winterquarters, Major General Spien having defired his Excellency to eafe him of that chirge, by reafon of an in difpofition he lies at prefen under. Hi Excellency tad aloted Winter quarter for the $A \|$ uffer as well as the other Confederate Troops in thefe Provinces, what fo they may be ready at hand to oppufe the defigns of the Enemy, who, we are affured, will begin thec campigne very early; but the faid Munfter Troops pietend not to beconcent with the quarters alortea thim, and are refolved to retura to Germany, and to winter in Werteravia; nortwithllanding all the endeavors ufed By his Excellency on diffuace them from it, as from a thing that will on their part bieak the meafures that have been taLenty ti, Excellency for the fecurity of thefe Countries. Yefter lay the Prince of Oranges Regiment of Fowr Guards paffed through this City, in order to cheir embark ng for folland; and the fame day three Dutch Regiments arrived hereby water from Ipres, who are to winter here, and Lieutenant General Alua is come hither, to fee that the neceflary provifion be made for them. The Duke of Holfein, Coun' Egmont, and musny other of our principal Officers are come hicher from the Army. Out Letrers fromstrasburg of the 22 tell us, thatrne Baggage of the Duke of Saxe-Eyfcmach had repaffed the R bine, but thie the Troops he had commanced this Sunmer viz. thole of Mentz, Heflen, Wr. wete marcted towards the $S_{a a r}$, to obferve the derachment fent chat way under the condutt of the Mard quis de Rannes. The Leters add, that the French decamped the 19 inftant fo filencly from Kochersberg, that the Imporiatits had no opportunity to attack their Rear; Gerieral Dunewaidd was fent out with 2000 Horfegbne reiurned witl:out detempting any thing. Tie 22 the Imperial Army decampedfrom Mettethaufin, but upon what defign was not kriown. The Sicur de Monclar had paffed the Rbinc at Brifac with a conficerable Bddy. From Liege they write,that the French are pro*iding greas Magazines at Sedan, Charleville, Dinamt, Pbilipuille:\&c. All the French Troops are drawn into their Winter-quarters within the New Conqueits.

Hague, Octob. ig. We have Letters from the Camp before stetion of the $i z$ whith fay that the Befiegers had fur feveral dayes advanced very little, by reafon of the inlusen her; that tonthe 19 the Befieged made a grear Sailye in wh ich; befides the Soldiers of the $G$ rifonl were 400 Burghers. The Befiegers own to daye lof usta men, and go or 40 Officers, and fay that the Beflegadilot abour 100. The next day the Befieged maden motmersally bu doat with that futceffs Erom Strasburg they writie, tliax.she Freach Atmy was decamped, and marched to Dachftein. sale.

Ditto, Nov.2. The Deputies of Grouingen and the Ommes linden having had feveral Conferences in order to the compor fing the differesces drpending between thent, and iaving clofed fo far, as thar there is a fair appearance of bringing the matter to an iffue, the faid Deputies are gone bome to confult their Principals, be fore they come ce a Ginal conctufion. Dun Emakxil de Lyma, the Envoy of Spaik, hath this week bad exveral Conferences with the Deputies of this State, concerning the intended Equipage for the Meditertanean, which will now be caken in hand a gain, 2 great Sum of Monry baving to that en betn remitted to Amflerdam. Several Regiments of Horfe are come to Bolduc, Breda, and other places from the $\mathrm{Ar}^{1}$ y, and the Officers begin to arrive here. We are told that ilicat Orders are given our, that they have Gomited therr Kecruith, y the firft of funuary, for that if the War continue, lie Eampagne will be begun very early the next year. This afternoon the Princes Regiment of Foot Guatds i: conte in here. From Nimegx nt they wrice, That the Canfederates con cinue to make dificulty to admit the Fnvoy of the Biflop of $S_{\text {rasabuig }} g$ to the Treaty. It is the wonder of all People that the Inhabitants of sietin pericyere fo obflinately in the defence of the place, when they cannot texpea any relief. It is the opinion of many, that if they can hold out but, a fhore time lunger, the Elector of Rrawh, buy will be forced, by the ill weaher, to quit the Sitge, at leaft to turn it into a Blokade,
Pa is, OCtob. 30. The Marquis de Eantes, who marched tom waris $S$ triruch, has whit him fix batalions and i2 Squadrons of Horle with whom is to join a detachment of the Sulfe and French Guards, and 6000 Horfe, fent by the Duke of Luxembx g Irom Flunders. The re is News at Court, that 6000 Poles are marching to afift the malecontents in Hungary. The Armules are nuw everywhere gone, or going into cheir Winterquarters. There is much talk of Peace ${ }^{2}$ but at the fame time the preparations for the War go on.
