The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS Information has been received from Sir Robert Ainflie, His Majefly's Ambaflador at Constantinople, that the Plague had begun to spread in different Quarters of that City, and had also appeared in Places in the Neighbourhood, and had also broken out at Foglieri, or Foggio, in the Bay of Smyrna; His Majesty in Council this Day took the same into Confideration; and although it appeared that a Qua-rantine of Forty Days is at this Time fubfilting, by Orders of this Board, upon all Ships and Veffels coming from or through the Mediterranean, or from the Weff Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, or from any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Spain within the Mediterranean, or from Minorca or Gibraltar, into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles - of Jerfey, Guernfey, Alderney, Sark or Man; and alfo upon all Ships and Veffels whatfoever arriving in the faid Ports having any Books, Silk Raw, Thrown or Wrought, Linen, Cotton-Wool, Cotton-Yarn, Grogtain or Mohair Yarn, Goats Hair, Car-menia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufacture of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw and Cotton, Matts and Matting, and Sails, being Goods more especially liable to retain Infection, and which may have been brought from Constantinople, and other Parts of the Levant, into other Countries; and from thence imported into His Majelty's Dominions in Ships not obliged to perform Quarantine; His Majelty judges it necessary upon this Occasion to cause the said Orders to be enforced; and to that End His Majelly doth hereby require and command all the Officers appointed for the Service of Quarantine to ule their utmost Care and Diligence in caufing the feveral Rules and Regulations established for the due Performance of Quarantine, to be punctually and flrictly observed and carried into Execution .: Whereof the faid Officers, and all others whom it may concern, are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly. PRESENT, The KING'S Moit Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS, by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Twenty-fixth Year of His late Majefty's Reign, initialed, "An Act to oblige Ships more effectually to perform their Quarantine, and for the better preventing the Plague being brought from Foreign Parts into Great Britain or V or Ireland, or the Illes of Guernfey, Jerfey, Alderney, Sark or Man," it is, among many other

Things, enacted, That all Ships and Veffels arri-ving, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes whatfoever, coming or imported into any Port or Place within Great Britain, or any of the Ifles afore-mentioned, from any Place from whence His Majesty, His Heirs or Successiors, by and with the Advice of His or Their Privy Council, shall judge it probable that the Infection may be brought, shall be obliged to make their Quarantine in fuch Place and Places, for fuch Time and in fuch Manner, as has been, or shall from Time to Time be, directed by His Majefty, His Heirs or Succeffors, by His or Their Order or Orders, made in His or Their Privy Council, and notified by Proclamation, or published in The London Gazette ; and that, until such Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes shall have respectively performed and be discharged from such Quarantine, no such Person, Goods, or Merchandizes, or any of them, fhall come or be brought on Shore, or go or be put on Board any other Ship or Veffel, in any Place within His Majefty's Dominions, unlefs in fuch Manner and in fuch Cafes, and by fuch Licence, as shall be directed or permitted by fuch Order or Orders made by His Majetty, His Heirs or Succeffors, in Council as aforefaid; and that all fuch Ships and Veffels, and the Perfons or Goods coming or imported in, or going or being put on Board the fame, and all Ships, Veffels, Boats, and Perfons receiving any Goods or Perfons out of the fame, shall be subject to such Orders, Rules, and Directions concerning Quarantine, and the Prevention of Infection, as have been or shall be made by His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, and notified by Proclamation, or pub-lifted in The London Gazette as afore mentioned, under fuch Pains and Penalties as are inflicted by the faid Act.

And whereas Information hath been received, That the Plague hath broke out and now rages at Chenon, at Oczakow in the Country which is called the Tartary of Oczakow, and in the Crimea, and hath manifested itself likewise upon the Frontiers of Poland : And His Majetty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon judge it probable, that the Infection may be brought into this Kingdom from Dantzick, or fome Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Jerley, Guernley, Alderney, Sark or Man, from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, which is to com-mence and be computed from the Day each Ship or Vessel shall come to Anchor in the Place appointed for performing Quarantine, and not be-

That

That the Places hereinafter named shall be and are hereby appointed to be the Places, wherein such Ships or Veffels (not having the Infection on Board) Inall respectively perform Quarantine; that is to fay, All such Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall perform their Quarantine in Stand-gate Creek. All fuch Ships or Vessels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Ipswich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Bofton, Hull, Newcattle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in Whitebooth Road between Hull and Grimfby. All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Carlifle and Chefter, or either of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Ifle of Man, fhall perform their Quarantine in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thereof. All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or shall be bound to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them or any of them, or to Padilow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, or Bridgwater, or within the faid Members or Creeks, shall perform their Quarantine in Kingroad and Porfhute Pill. All fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and alfo except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the Port of Exeter, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, or to the Port of Pool, or any of the Members or Creeks, or other Places within the faid Ports of Plymouth, Exeter, and Pool, except as before excepted, shall perform their Quarantine in fome Place between Woodend and Saltash in the River Tamer. All fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to Falmouth, a Member of the Port of Plymouth, or any Creek thereof, or any other Place therein, shall perform their Quarantine in a Place called St. Ives Pool, within the Mouth of the Harbour of Falmouth. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Ports of Southampton, Chichefter, Sandwich, or any of them, or any of the Members or Creeks thereof, or of any of them, or any other Place within the fame, fhall perform their Quarantine at a Place called the Mother Bank near Portfmouth. And all fuch Ships or Veffels, as are or shall be bound to the Eastern Coaft of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Leith, Borrowstoness, Alloa, Dunbar, Kirkaldy, Anstruther, Preslon Pans, Dundee, Perth, Montrole, and Aberdeen, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Inverkeithing Bay. Aand all fuch Ships and Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Western Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Port Glafgow, Greenock, Irvine, Campbeltoun, Oban, Rothfay, Fort William, Air, Port Patrick, Stranraer, and Wigtown, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Lamlash in the Island of Arran. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the Northern Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Inverness, Zetland, Orkney, Caithnefs, and Stornaway. or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, shall perform their Quarantine in Cromarty Bay in the Murray Frith. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as are or shall be bound to the South west Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of Dumfries and Kirkcudbright, or to any Member, Creek, or other Parts

at the Mouth of the River Nith. And all fuch Ships or Veffels which are or fhall be bound to the ifle of Jerfey, or any Part thereof, fhall perform their Quarantine at a certain Place on the Coaft of the faid Ifland called Belle Croute, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England. And all fuch Ships or Veffels as fhail be bound to the Iflands of Guernfey, Sark or Alderney, or either of them, or any Pait of them, or any of them, fhall perform their Quarantine in a Place near the Ifland of Guernfey, called the Little Road, or at fome Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coait of England.

That no Pilot shall go on Board any Ship or Veffel obliged to perform Quarantine, in order to conduct the fame into any Port or Place, but shall perform such Service in some other Boat or Vessel, which Boat or Vessel shall keep as much to the Windward of the Ship or Vessel, so to be conducted, as possible; and if any Pilot or other Person shall go on Board such Ship or Vessel, so the Person shall go on Board fuch Ship or Vessel, in like Manner as any Person coming in such Ship or Vessel shall be obliged to perform the same.

That all Goods, Wares and Merchandizes liable to Quarantine as aforefaid, shall be opened, unpacked and aired, unlefs His Majefty shall think fir, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain a Week, other than Hemp and Flax, Paper or Books, Silk Raw, Thrown, or Wrought, inen, Cotton Wool, Cotton Yarn or manufactured, Wool Raw or any wife Wrought, Feathers, Grograin or Mohair Yam, Human Hair, Goats Hair, Carmenia Wool, Carpets, Camblets, Burdets, or other Manufactures of Silk and Cotton, Kid Skins, and Skins in the Wool or Hair, Spunges, Wine, and Oil in Chefts, Thread Stockings, all Goods packed with Straw or Cotton, Straw Hats, and Brushes, Matting and Artificial Flowers; which Goods and Merchandizes, fo as aforefaid enumerated, are to be opened, unpacked, and aired, unlefs His Majefty shall think fit, by His Order in Council, to direct otherwife, and fo remain for the Space of a Fortnight.

That all Goods imported by fuch Ships and Veffels respectively shall be aired in the following Places, that is to fay : All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Port of London, or any Member, Creek, or other Parts thereof, or to the River Thames, or Medway, shall be aired in Standgate Creek: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Ipswich, Yarmouth, Lynn, Boston, Hull, Newcastle, or Berwick upon Tweed, or any of them, or any Member or Creek thereof, or other Place therein, shall be aired in Whitebooth Road, between Hull and Grimsby: All such Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Carlisle and Cheller, or either of them, or any Member ro Creek thereof, or other Place therein, or to any Part of the Isle of Man, shall be aired in a Place called Highlake, near Liverpool, at the Weft End thercof: All fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Bristol, Bridgwater, or any of them, or any Member or Creek of them, or any of them, or to Padílow or St. Ives, being Members of the Port of Plymouth, or to Ilfracomb or Barnstaple, being Members of the Port of Exeter, or to any other Place within the faid Ports of Milford, Cardiff, Gloucester, Briftol, or Bridgwater, or within the faid Mem-bers or Creeks, shall be aired in Kingroad and Porshute Pill: All such Goods as shall be imported to the Port of Plymouth, except fuch Parts thereof as have been herein before mentioned, and alfo except Falmouth, one Member thereof, or to the shereof, shall perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, | Port of Exeter, except such Parts thereof as have heen

And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Isle of Jersey, or any Part thereof, shall be aired at a certain Place on the Coast of the faid Island called Belle Croute, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coast of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are imported, shall repetively perform their Quarantine : And all fuch Goods as shall be imported to the Islands of Guernfey, Sark, or Alderney, or either of them or any Part of them, or any of them, shall be aired in a Place near the Island of Guernsey, called the Little Road, or at fuch Place herein before appointed for Performance of Quarantine on the Coaft of England, where the Ships, in which fuch Goods are im ported, shall respectively perform their Quarantine.

That whatfoever Ship or Perfon shall receive any Men or Goods from on Board any Ship or Veffel under Quarantine, shall be compelled to perform the like Quarantine.

That fuch Perfons as, after Quarantine performed, shall be employed in the Hold of any Ship or Vessel, for the taking any Goods not liable to retain Infection from the Goods and Merchandizes before enu merated, shall be obliged to perform a new Quarantine,

That the Captains of every of His Majefty's Ships of War, who shall meet any such Ship or Vessel coming to any of the Ports of Great Britain or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark or Man, fhall take due Care to prevent the Landing any Goods, Seamen or Passengers from on Board the fame, until they shall be put under the Direction of the Officers of His Majesty's Customs.

That the Commissioners and other Officers of His Majelty's Cuftoms do use their utmost Diligence and Care, that the Quarantine before directed be duly performed.

That the Commanders of His Majeity's Ships of War, as likewife the Commanders of His Majelty's Forts and Garrifons lying near the Sea Coafts, and all the Juffices of the Peace, Mayors, Sheriffs, Bailiffs, Chief Magistrates, Constables, Headboroughs, Tything-Men, and all other Officers and Ministers of Juffice, be aiding and affitting to the faid Officers of His Majesty's Customs, and to all others that shall be concerned in stopping all such Ships as aforefaid, and in bringing them to the Places appointed for the Performance of their Quarantine, and in due Performance thereof.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Of-fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid respective lsles of Jersey, Gueinsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
