Windsor Castle, August 7.

THIS Morning, at a Quarter before One o'Clock, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess.

This great Event was made known by the firing of the Park and Tower Guns.

Her Majesty is, God be praised, as well as can be expected; and the young Princess is in perfect Health.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 8th of August, 1783,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that sundry Ships and Vessels are arrived, and others expected daily to arrive, from Dantzick and other Ports in Royal and Ducal Prussia and Pomerania, laden solely with Corn and other Grain; that the Corn from the Baltick, by the Length of the Voyage and the Warmth of the Weather, is very much heated, and nearly in a State of Fermentation; and that it is of the utmost Importance that the said Ships and Vessels should be exempted from the Performance of Quarantine, and permitted to deliver their Cargoes as soon as possible after their Arrival; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, so far as respects Ships laden with Corn or Grain, be taken off; and that all Ships and Vessels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, laden with Corn or Grain, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine; provided the proper Officer, on mustering the Crew, shall find them all in Health; that none of the Crew have died or been sick of any contagious Distemper during the Voyage; that the Ship hath not had Communication with any Ship or Vessel coming from any infected Place; and that there are no Enumerated Goods on board, other than the Bags or Sacks in which the said Corn is contained, or Matts made Use of solely for the Purpose of Dunnage: And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney,

Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
