The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS, upon Information received that the Plague had broke out at Cherson, at Oczakow, in the Country which is called the Tartary of Oczakow, and in the Crimea, and had manifested itself likewise upon the Frontiers of Poland, His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council or the 25th of July last, to direct, that all Ships and Vessels then arrived, or that should thereafter arrive from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania, should make their Quarantine for Forty Days: And whereas there was this Day read at the Board a Letter from the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Dalrymple, Hi: Majesty's Ministe: Plenipotentiary at Warsaw, Azing, that notwithstanding the Reports that had been spread, the Plague had not appeared in any Part of Poland; and that, according to the last Letters from Cherson, no Symptoms of that Ditorder had been discovered there since the Beginning of June: His Majesty, taking the same into Confideration, and being de-firous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be confisent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Koyal or Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, be taken off; and that all Ships and Vessels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine; provided that the Matter or other Perion taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Custom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Place to which such Ships are bound, that their Crews are free from all infection, and that they have not had Communication with any Ship or Vessel coming from any infected Place.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Ma-· jesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Muster-General of the Ordnance, His Majetty's Sccretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS it has been represented to His Ma-iests at this Road that the Control of the Majesty at this Board, that fundry Ships and Vesfels are arrived, and others expected daily to arrive, from Dantzick and other Ports in Royal and Ducal Prustia and Pomerania, laden solely with Corn and other Grain; that the Corn from the Baltick, by the Length of the Voyage and the Warmth of the Weather, is very much heated, and nearly in a State of Fermentation; and that it is of the utmost Importance that the said Ships and Vessels should be exercipted from the Performance of Quarantine, and permitted to deliver their Cargoes as toon as possible after their Arrival; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, That the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from Dantzick, or any other Portor Place in Royal and Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, so far as respects Ships laden with Corn or Grain, be taken off; and that all Ships and Veilels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, laden with Corn or Grain, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine; provided the proper Officer, on mustering the Crew, shall find them all in Health; that none of the Crew have died or been fick of any contagious Distemper during the Voyage; that the Ship hath not had Communication with any Ship or Vessel coming from any infected Place; and that there are no Enumerated Goods on board, other than the Bags or Sacks in which the faid Corn is contained, of Matts made Use of solely for the Purpose of Dunnage: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
