N Sunday last One of the King's Messengers arrived here with the Ratification of the Provisional Articles, signed the 30th of November last, which was exchanged on the 13th Instant at Paris, between His Majesty's Plenipotentiary and the Plenipotentiaries of the United States of America.

The King has been pleased to appoint Alleyne Fitz-Herbert, Esq; to be His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to the Court of Petersburgh.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS, upon Information received that the Plague had broke out at Cherson, at Oczakow, in the Country which is called the Tartary of Oczakow, and in the Crimea, and had manifested itself likewise upon the Frontiers of Poland, His Majetty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 25th of July last, to direct, that all Ships and Vessels then arrived, or that should thereafter arrive from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, should make their Quarantine for Forty Days: And whereas there was this Day read at the Board a Letter from the Right Honourable Lord Viscount Dalrymple, His Majetty's Minister Plenipotentiary at Warlaw, stating, that notwithstanding the Reports that had been spread, the Plague had not appeared in any Part of Poland; and that, according to the last Letters from Cherson, no Symptoms of that Disorder had been discovered there aree the Beginning of June: His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being defirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be confiltent with the Safety of His Subjects, is maifed, with the Advice of His Privy Counc., to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Qu. antine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Prussia or Pomerania, be taken off; and that all Ships and Vessels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine; provided that the Master or other Person taking Charge of such Ship or Vessel, do first make Oath before the Custom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Place to which fuch Ships are bound, that their Crews are free from all infection, and that they have not had Communication with any Ship or Vessel coming from any infected Place.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, His Majety's Sccretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
