HEREAS, upon Information re-ceived that the Plague had broke out at Cherson, at Oczakow, in the Coun-

V try which is called the Tartary of Oczakow, and in the Crimea, and had mani-fefted itfelf likewife upon the Frontiers of Po-land His Moisfur and the Tartary of land, His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 25th of July laft, to direct, that all Ships and Veffels then arrived, or that fhould thereafter arrive from Dantzicl:, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania, should make their Quarantine for Forty Days: And whereas there was this Day read at the Board a Letter from the Right Honourable Lord Vilcount Dalrymple, His Majefty's Minister Plenipotentiary at Warfaw, flating, that notwithflanding the Re-ports that had been fpread, the Plague had not appeared in any Part of Poland; and that, ac-cording to the last Letters from Cherfon, no Symptoms of that Diforder had been difcovered there fince the Beginning of June: His Majefty, taking the fame into Confideration, and being defirous to remove all Reftraints upon Trade, fo far as may be confistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine at prefent fubfilting upon all Ships and Veffels coming from Dantzick, or any other Port or Place in Royal or Ducal Pruffia or Pomerania, be taken off; and that all Ships and Veffels already arrived, or that may hereafter arrive from those Places, be permitted to discharge their respective La dings, without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine; provided that the Mafter or other Perfor taking Charge of fuch Ship or Veffel, do first make Oath before the Cuf tom-House Officer or Chief Magistrate at the Place to which fuch Ships are bound, that their Crews are free from all Infection, and that they have not had Communication with any Ship or Veffel coming from any infected Place.—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Briain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Maffer General of the Ordnance, His Majefty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in
