PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. T is this Day ordered by His Majesty in Council, That the Embargo at present subsisting upon Ships and Vessel laden or to be laden in the Ports of Great Britain and Ireland with Provisions, be taken off; and that the several Regulations contained in His Majesty's Order of the 18th of August, 1780, shall cease and determine : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland, are to give such Directions for taking off the faid Embargo, as to them may respectively appertain.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for preventing certain Instruments from "being required from Ships belonging to the "United States of America, and to give to His "Majesty, for a limited Time, certain Powers "for the better carrying on Trade and Com-"merce between the Subjects of His Majesty's Do-"minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United "States," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, "That in any Cafe, where a Certificate is required to discharge any Bond entered into for the due landing Goods within the faid United States, fuch Bond shall and may be discharged upon a Certificate under the Hands and Seals of any Officers who are or may be appointed by the faid United States, or any of them, for that Purpose; and if it stall happen that there shall not be any Officer fo appointed, then,

and in fuch Cafe, fuch Bond Itall and may be difcharged upon a Certificate; under the Hand and Seal of any Magistrate of the faid United States, or any of them, certifying that there is no fuch Officer at fuch Fort or Place, and that Oath hath been made Before fuch Magiftate, by the Matter or other Perfon hav-ing the Charge of fuch Ship; that the Goods, for which fuch Certificate is required, were duly landed by him within the faid United States. And by the faid Act it is also further enacted, That, during the Continuance of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to give such Directions and to make fuch Regulations with refpect to Duties, Drawbäcks or otherwife, for carrying on the Trade and Com-merce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the faid United States, as to His Majefty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Law, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding. And whereas by an A& passed in the Twelfth Year of King Charles the Second, commonly called the Act of Navigation, and feveral other Acts made in this Kingdom, certain Enumerated Articles are not to be carried from any British Colony or Plantation in America, unlefs to fome other Britifh Colony or Plantation, or to this Kingdom, and upon the failing of every Ship from this Kingdom, or from any fuch British Colony or Plantation, Bond and Security is required to be taken for the carrying fuch Enumerated Goods, according to the Directions of the faid Acts. And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 2d of July laft, it was judged expedient to permit that Rum, Sugar, Was Judged expedient to permit that Kum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa Nuts, Ginger, and Pi-mento, should, until further Order, be exported by British Subjects, in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated accord-ing to Law, from any of His Majesty's West India Islands, to any Port or Place within the United States of America, upon the Payment of the fame Duties on Exportation, and subject to the like Rules, Regulations, Securities and Relfrictions, as the fame Articles by Law are or may be fubject or liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America: His Majesty doth, by and with the Ad-vice of His Privy Council, hereby further direct, That for Ships clearing out from any of the Ports of this Kinedon to your of the Wight of this Kingdom to any of His Majefly's Weft India Iflands, or from any of His Majefly's faid Weft India Iflands, which shall take on Board there any of the Articles permitted by His Majefly's Or-der in Conneil of the 2d of July laft, to be carried from thence to any Port or Place within the United · States
