Dublin Castle, September 23, 1783.

YESTER DAY being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was hoisted on Bedford Tower: At Noon the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks: In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.
