A PROCLAMATION. GEORGE R.

HEREAS a Definitive Treaty of Peace and Friendship, between Us, the Most Christian King, and the King of Spain, bath been concluded

King of Spain, hath been concluded at Verfailles on the Third Day of this Inftant September, and the Ratifications thereof have been exchanged upon the Nineteenth Inftant; In Conformity thereunto, We have thought fit hereby to command, That the fame be published throughout all Our Dominions. And We do declare to all Our loving Subjects Our Will and Pleafure, That the faid Treaty of Peace and Friendship be observed inviolably, as well by Sea as Land, and in all Places whatfoever; ftrictly charging and commanding all Our loving Subjects to take Notice hereof, and conform themselves thereunto accordingly.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fixth Day of September, One thoufand feven hundred and eighty-three, in the Twenty-third Year of Our Reign.

O UR Will and Pleafure is, that you give immediate Directions to the Heralds, Purfuivants of Arms, and other neceffary Officers, to attend the Proclamation of Peace that is to be made on Monday the Sixth Day of October next, in the ufual Places, and with the Solemnities cuftomary on the like Occafion. A Party of Horse Guards.

At Charing Crois Norroy King of Arms read the Proclamation aloud; and the Proceffion moved on in the fame Order to Temple Bar, the Gates of which being flut, Rouge Dragon Purfuivant of Arms left the Proceffion, and, accompanied by Two Trumpeters, preceded by Two Horfe Guards to clear the Way, rode up to the Gate; and, after the Trumpets had founded thrice, he knocked with his Cane. Being afked by the City Marfhal from within "Wbo comes there?" he replied, The Officers of Arms, who demand Entrance into the City to publif His Majefly's Proclamation of Peace. The Gates being opened, he was admitted alone, and the Gates were immediately flut again. The City Marfhal, preceded by his Officers, conducted him to the Lord Mayor, (who with the Aldermen, Recorder and Sheriffs, attended within the Gate) to whom he fhewed His Majefly's Warrant, which his Lordfhip having read, returned, and gave Directions to the City Marfhal to open the Gates, who attending the Purfuivant back, opened them accordingly, and on leaving him, faid, Sir, the Gates are opened. The Trumpets and Horfe Guards being in Waiting, conducted him to his Place in the Proceffion, which then moved on, into the City, except the Officers of Weftminfter, who filed off and retired as they came to Temple Bar. At Chancery Lane End, Somesfet Herald read the Proclamation, and the City Officers then falling into the Proceffion, immediately after the Officers of Arms, is moved on to the End of Wood Strees, where the Crofe

Crofs formerly flood in Cheapfide'; after the Pro-clamation had been read here by Richmond Herald, the Procession moved on to the Royal Exchange, where the Proclamation was read for the last Time by Rouge Croix Pursuivant. The Spectators, who were very numerous at each Place, expreffing their Satifaction by loud Acclamations.
