St. James's, October 25.

THIS Day being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, when His Majesty entered into the Twenty-fourth Year of His-Reign, the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other public Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

Whitehall, October 25.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Right Honourable Lord William Cavendish Bentinck, the Office of Clerk of the Pipe, in the Room of Sir John Shelley, Bart. deceased.

The King has been pleased to grant to Anthony Lovibond, Esq; and his Issue, (pursuant to the Will of his Cousin the Honourable Elizabeth Cary, Widow, deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Collins, in Addition to that of Lovibond; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

Constantinople, September 25. The Plague still continues in this Capital, and the Mortality has rather increased during the last Fifteen Days.

Saonica, September 10. On the 6th Instant we had Two smart Shocks of an Earthquake. On the 8th, at Half past Eight in the Morning, we had a very violent One, and, in the Space of a Quarter of an Hour, Three others, and Eleven more within the Twenty-four Hours. Part of the City Walls, a Bagnio and some other Buildings were thrown down.
