WHEREAS on Friday the 10th Inftent, Richard Morze and William Ward, Officers of this Ma-jefty's Customs, in the Port of Portimouth, in attemptjefty's Customs, in the Fort of Fortymouth, in attempting to board a Vessel called the Eagle, Camelius Rose, Master, from Alecrney, then being in Langstone Harbour, within the Limits of the said Rose, who alently and forcibly obstructed by the said Rose, who as first resulted them Admittance, and being armed with an Hatchet, threatened Death to any Man that should attempt to board his Veffel; but to which he at length confented; when the faid Officers baving got on Board were knocked down by the said Rose, and, on their making some Resistance, Morze had one of his Fingers cut from bis Right Hand, and both bin and Ward were much bruised and beat: That being thus vio-lently affaulted, and apprehending their Liwes in Dan-ger, they were obliged to quit the said Vessel in order to get further Assistance, which having procured, they again attempted to go on Board, in which, after some Obstruction, they succeeded, and seized and carried the said Vessel into Portsmouth Harbour; but the said Cornelius Rose made his Escape by jumping overboard, and swimming to a Wherry, into which he was taken up,

and carried off to Sea.

The Commissioners of His Majests's Customs, in order to bring the aforefuld Rose to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person or Persens who shall apprehend or cause to be apprebended the said Rose, so that he may be taken before a Magistrate and committed for the foid Off nce; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majejly's Customs upon Conviction.
