Y Dublin Castle, October 24, 1783.
ESTERDAY being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in State to Christ Church, attended by several of the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, where a Sermon, suitable to the Occasion, was preached by the Lord Bishop of Dromore. And on his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks.

Peterburgh, October 3. Wednesday last being the Anniversary of the Great Duke's Birth-Day, there was a grand Gala at Court, with a Ball in the Evening; and this Day being the Anniversary of the Empress's Coronation, it was celebrated in the same Manner, when her Imperial Majesty was pleased to decorate Five or Six Persons with the G. and Cross, and near a Hundred with the Third and Fourth Crosses of the new Order of St. Vladimir.

Custom-House, London, October 24, 1783.

WHEREAS on Friday the 10th Instant, Richard Morze and William Ward, Officers of His Majesty's Customs, in the Port of Portsmouth, in attempting to board a Vessel called the Eagle, Cornelius Rose, Master, from Amurney, then being in Langstone Harbour, within the Limits of the said Port, were violently and forcibly obstructed by the said Rose, who at first refused them Admittance, and being armed with an Hatchet, threatened Death to any Man that should attempt to board his Vessel; but to which he at length consented; when the said Officers having got on Board were knocked down by the said Rose, and, on their making some Resistance, Morze had one of his Fingers cut from his Right Hand, and both him and Ward were much bruised and beat: That being thus violently assaulted, and apprehending their Lives in Danger, they were obliged to quit the said Vessel in order to get further Assistance, which having procured, they again attempted to go on Board, in which, after some Obstruction, they succeeded, and seized and carried the said Vessel into Portsmouth Harbour; but the said Cornelius Rose made his Escape by jumping overboard, and swimming to a Wherry, into which he was taken up, and carried off to Sea.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the aforesaid Rose to Justice, do hereby promise a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS to any Person or Persons who shall apprehend or cause to be apprehended the said Rose, so that he may be taken before a Magistrate and committed for the said Office; to be paid by the Receiver-General of His Majesty's Customs upon Conviction.
