HE King has been pleased to grant to George Stovin, of Titley, in the Parish of Crowle, in the County of Lincoln, Esq; and his Issue (pursuant to the last Will of Thomas Lister, late of Girsby, in the said County, Esq; deceased) His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname and bear the Arms of Lister only, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

WHEREAS on Friday the 10th Instant, Richard Morze and William Ward, Officers of H.s Mainterze and william ward, Officer of his ma-jests's Customs, in the Port of Fortmouth, in attempt-ing to board a Vest called the Eogle, Cornelius Rose, Master, from Aderney, then being in Langstone Harbour, within the Limits of the faid P.rt, were vio-lently and forcibly obstructed by the faid Role, subo at first resused them Admittance, and being a med with an Hatchet, threatened Death to any Man that should attempt to board his V. fel; but to which he at length confented; when the faid Officers having rot on Ecard were knocked down by the faid Refe, and, on their making some Refistance, Marze bad one of his Fingers cut from his Right Hand, and his him and Ward were much bruised and heat: That being thus vio lently uffaulted, and apprehending their Lives in Danger, they were obliged to quit the jaid Veffel in order to get further Assistance, wwich baving procured, they again attempted to g. on Board, in which, after some Obstruction, they succeeded, and seized and carried the said Vessel into Portsmouth Harbour; but the said Cornelius Rose made his Escape by jumping overboard, and swimming to a Wherry, into which he was taken up,

and carried off to Sea.
