AT the Court at St. James's, the 5th of November, 1783,

The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. THEREAS by His Majefty's Order in Council, bearing Date the 6th of June laft, allowing the Importation of To-

bacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, and from thence imported directly into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Ships, by Britith Subjects, or by any of the Peo  $\pm$  inhabiting in, or belonging to, the faid United 5  $\infty s$ , or sny of them, and containing Re-gulations is the Landing and Warehoufing, under His Majefiy's Locks, all fuch Tobacco, it is, among other Things, directed, That the Importer fhall pay down in ready Money the Duty commonly called the Old Sublidy: And whereas by an Act paffed in the laft Seffion of Parliament, intituled, \* An Act for preventing certain Inftruments from \* being required from Ships belonging to the \* United States of America, and to give to His "Majeity, for a limited Time, certain Powers for the better carrying on Trade and Com-merce between the Subjects of His Majefty's Do-" minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United " States," it is, amongst other Things, enasted, That during the Continuance of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to give fuch Directions and to make fuch Regulations with respect to Duties, Drawbacks or otherwise, for carrying on the Trade and Com-nierce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the faid United States, as to His Majetty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Law, Ulage or Custom to the contrary notwithlanding: His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and direct, That the Importer of any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, and imported directly from thence into the Ports of London, Briftol, Liverpool, Cowes, Whitehaven, and Greenock, or either of them, in the Manner expressed in the above recited Order, shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment as well of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the further Daties due for fuch Tobacco, in the Manner, and with the Allowances mentioned in the faid Order: And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order and direct, That if any Tobacto which has been or shall be so imported, during the Con inuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Briftol, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, and Greenock, Thall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, set of the Warehouses wherein the fame shall be

fecured under His Majesty's Locks, as directed by the before recited Order, at either of the above Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been, or shall be, entered into for Pay-ment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parliament in Force. And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
