*Ceremonial of the Introduction of His Royal Highness George Augustus Frederick Prince of WALES, into the House of Peers, at the Meeting of Parliament on Tuesday November 11, 1783.*

**H**IS Royal Highness having been, by Letters Patent dated the 19th Day of August, in the Second Year of His Majesty's Reign, created Prince of Wales and Earl of Chester, was, in His Robes, which with the Collar of the Order of the Garter he had put on in the Earl Marshal's Room, introduced into the House of Peers in the following Order:

Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod,  
with his Staff of Office.  
Earl of Surrey,  
Deputy Earl Marshal of England.  
Earl of Carlisle,  
Lord Privy Seal.

Garter Principal King of Arms, in his Robe, with  
his Sceptre, bearing his Royal Highness's Patent.  
Sir Peter Burrell,  
Deputy Great Chamberlain of England.  
Viscount Stormont,  
Lord President of the Council.

### THE CORONET

On a Crimson Velvet Cushion, borne by Viscount Lewisham, One of the Gentlemen of His Royal Highness's Bed-Chamber.

His Royal Highness the PRINCE OF WALES,  
Carrying his Writ of Summons, supported by his Uncle, his Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland, and the Dukes of Richmond and Portland.

And proceeding up the House with the usual Reverences, the Writ and Patent were delivered to the Earl of Mansfield, Speaker, on the Woolfack, and read by the Clerk of the Parliament at the Table, His Royal Highness and the rest of the Procession standing near: After which His Royal Highness was conducted to His Chair on the Right Hand of the Throne, the Coronet and Cushion having been laid on a Stool before the Chair; and his Royal Highness being covered as usual, the Ceremony ended.

Some Time after His Majesty entered the House of Peers, and was seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnities, and having delivered His most gracious Speech, retired out of the House.

Then His Royal Highness at the Table took the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy, and made and subscribed the Declaration; and also took and subscribed the Oath of Abjuration.

Dublin Castle, November 4, 1783.

This Day being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third, of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; at Noon, there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William: On his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in College Green; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

Dublin Castle, November 5, 1783.

This Day being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square of the Barracks; and the Evening concluded with Illuminations, Bonfires, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

Vienna, October 29. The Emperor has given the Great Cross of the Order of St. Stephen to the following Persons, viz. the Reigning Prince Reufs, Count Nollitz, Great Burggrave of Prague, the Vice-Chancellor Count Cobenzel, Baron de Reischach, Count Joseph Kaunitz, Ambassador in Spain, Count Durazzo, Ambassador at Venice, and Count Lewis Cobenzel, Minister at Peterburgh.

The Empress of Russia has sent the Order of St. Vladimir to Prince Gallitzin, her Minister at this Court.

**WHEREAS** on Friday the 10th Instant, Richard Morze and William Ward, Officers of His Majesty's Customs, in the Port of Portsmouth, in attempting to board a Vessel called the Eagle, Cornelius Rose, Master, from Alderney, then being in Langstone Harbour, within the Limits of the said Port, were violently and forcibly obstructed by the said Rose, who at first refused them Admittance, and being armed with an Hatchet, threatened Death to any Man that should attempt to board his Vessel; but to which he at length consented; when the said Officers having got on Board were knocked down by the said Rose, and, on their making some Resistance, Morze had one of his Fingers cut from his Right Hand, and both him and Ward were much bruised and beat: That being thus violently assaulted, and apprehending their Lives in Danger, they were obliged to quit the said Vessel in order to get further Assistance, which having procured, they again attempted to go on Board, in which, after some Obstruction, they succeeded, and seized and carried the said Vessel into Portsmouth Harbour; but the said Cornelius Rose made his Escape by jumping overboard, and swimming to a Wherry, into which he was taken up, and carried off to Sea.
