WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 5th Inftant, to direct, That the Importer of any Tobacco, being the Growth I hat the importer of any lobacco, being the Growth or Production of the Territories of the United States of America, and imported directly from thence, either in British or American Ships, by by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabit-ing in, or belonging to, the faid United States, or any of them, into the Ports of London, Brittol, Liverpool, Cowes, Whitehaven, and Greenock, or either of them, should be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the further Duties due for fuch Tobacco, in the Manner, and with the Allowances mentioned in His Majesty's Order in Council of the 6th of June last: And whereas it has been reprefented to His Majetty, that fome Doubts may arife con-cerning the Allowances to be made upon Payment of the faid Duties, for which Bonds have been, or may be fo entered into, upon the Importation of any fuch l'obacco into the Ports mentioned in the faid recited Order; His Majefty is thereupon pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and doth hereby declare and order, That nothing contained in His Majefty's faid Order in Council of the 5th Inftant, shall be confirued to extend to the making any Allowance for Payment of fo much of the faid Duties, as the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy, shall amount to :-- And His Majesty is hereby further pleafed to order, with the Advice aforefaid, that the Liberty given by the faid recited Order of the 5th of this Initant Novem-ber, fhall, in all Respects, be extended to Tobacco imported into, and exported from, the Port of Glaigow, under the Regulations and Restrictions in the faid Order mentioned : And the Right Honuurable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treatury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

States of America, and from thence imported directly into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in Bri-tifh or American Ships, by Britifh Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, or belonging to, the faid United States, or any of them, and containing Re-gulations for the Landing and Warehousing, under His Majelty's Locks, all fuch Tobacco, it is, among other Things, directed, That the Importer shall pay down in ready Money the Duty commonly called the Old Subfidy: And whereas by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for preventing certain Infruments, intrustor, "An Act for preventing certain Infruments from "being required from Ships belonging to the "United States of America, and to give to His "Majefty, for a limited Time, certain Powers "for the better carrying on Trade and Com-"merce between the Subjects of His Majefty's Do-"minors and the Inhabitants of the faid United " minions and the Inhabitants of the faid United " States," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That during the Continuance of the faid Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majelty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to give such Directions and to make fuch Regulations with respect to Duties, Drawbacks or otherwise, for carrying on the Trade and Com-merce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain, and the People and Territories of the faid United States, as to His Majefty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary, any Law, Ufage or Cuftom to the contrary notwithftanding: His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and direct, That the Importer of any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Toritorian of the field United Space of the Territories of the faid United States of America, and imported directly from thence into the Ports of London, Briftol, Liverpool, Cowes, Whitehaven, and Greenoek, or either of them, in the Manner expressed in the above-recited Order, fhall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment as well of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the further Duties due for fuch Tobacco, in the Manner, and with the Allowances mentioned in the faid Order: And His Majelty is hereby further pleafed to order and direct, That if any Tobacco which has been or shall be fo imported, during the Continuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Brif-tol, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, and Greenock, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limitted, out of the Warehouses wherein the same shall be secured under His Majesty's Locks, as directed by the before recited Order, at either of the above Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonda which have been, or fhall be, entered into for Pay-ment of the faid Duties, fhall be difcharged in Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parhament in Force.
