Edenburgh, January 19.

Dub.in, January 19. Upon News of the French preparations, all Officers were ordered to repair to their garrilons and commands, and the Countries in all places put into such a posture, that they fear not any attempts that can be made upon them.

Berwick, January, 20. A Vessel belonging to Yarmouth bound for New-Gastle with empty Caske, about twelve miles to the Northwards of this Town, unfortunately ran The men came all of them safe to shoare, and are returning homewards, the Marter and his Mate staying behind to recover what they can of her Rigging.

Elsenberg, Jan. 3. We are here told of an Envoye that is upon his way from the New Cham of Tartary to the Court of Denmark to communicate to his Majesty the news of his affuming the Throne, and Enstating in the Dignity of Chim of the Crim Tartars: and 'tis said by him that two other Envoyes are dispatche on the same business, one of them to the Emperor, the other to the King of Swedeland.

The Danes feem much weary of the War, their flock of moneys being drawn very low, and their loffes having of late been very confiderable, however their inclinations are, they are at present obliged to steer according to the motion of their more powerful allyes.

Vienna, Jan. 9. This Court continues still in jolli y, diverting themselves with all imaginable Recreations, in which the Horse Baller takes exceedingly for its bravery, and the rarity of shows of that nature, yet are they not without apprehensions of the drawing together of the Turks, which they fear will not only throw troubles on the Prince Ragotshi, but if some timely remedy be not applyed; may occasion some more general distemper in the Empire. On the other hand the encreasing preparations of the French makes us hasten our Leavies, which are like to be very considerable, for the desence of all parts of the Empire, where any diffurbances may be feared. Nor is our care less for settling the affaires of Hungary, to make way for the enfuing Diet: the Reformed and Evangelick States of Upper Hungary, being it leems resolved not to make their appearance at a New Diet; till their demands which remained unresolved in the last, be first granted to them; but the consultation held with the Palazine of Hungary, and other Grandees, will foon put an

end to those distitultys, and we lione satisfy all parties. 'Tis thought that the Turks forces drawn together about the Fort Jenova, and the Island of Jula, may probably be employed against the Tartars, the Turks not finding it con-Venient to continue things in the present state in which they are, but to endeavor rather to remove the Tartars out of those Garrisons, where at present they are mixed with ithe Turke, some little time will more assure us of their intention.

The Spanish Ambassador, since his reconcilement with the Comte of Kevenhuller, is preparing a very magnificent Banquet, with which he intends to entertain the principal Ministers about the Court. His Lady seemed lately highly concerned, that her Chayre was stopt by the Guards, from coming into the Ritterstub, sending immediately her complaints to the High Chamberlain, but being enformed both by him, and by a message from the Emperor of the customs of that Court, which permitted not that liberty to the Empress her felf, to enter the Antichamber in a Chayre, she was calily latisfied.

The Venetian Ambassadour has at his Audience, and at other times pressed hard for Assistance against the Turks, who has been honourably Entertained and received, but with what fuccels in his Delires, is not yet known.

The Affairs between the Electors of Palatine and Mayence, are in a fair way of Accommodation, and we suppose no new matter can eafily be offered to disturb the Agreement.

Dantzig, fan. 12. We are affured of the diffolution of the Diet of Poland, with much more disorder than it began : can the Nobility there be brought to hearken to the Election of a Successor to the Crown, during the life of the present No further News of their success against the Rebell Tartars and Coffacks, that so surjously invaded them; but it has been confidently reported, that they were forced to give round to a body of Poles, who successfully charged them, killing a great number of them, taking many priloners, and forcing them to quit a confiderable quantity of their

plundered booty.

Andaluzia Decemb. 30. The great expectations of all these parts are set upon the Negotiations between this Kingdom and our Neighbours of Portugal; the flow precedure whereof gives us some reason to fear that affair will not have that praceable issue which the suffering condition of both Countreys requires. The time of the year which usually keeps all parties from action, has not been idly past away here; fince we have lately had some reports, that the Portugals had made an attempt upon Oios in Moraletta, which they had taken and burnt, returning with some considerable booty; and that our General, the Marquels of Caracene, had drawin his forces together, with the addition of some others drawn out of several Garrisons, with an intention to revenge that exploit, by doing the like to Castel Dochon; which he was pleased to preserve the last year from the like sate, upon the promise of 4000. pieces of Eight, which nevertheless were not paid to him. The preparations for the carrying on of the War proceed vigoroufly on both fides: It has been likewife said, that Don John of Austria is designed to be sent by his Majesty to the Emperor, and Don Francisco Friesiosa into Flanders, to the Marquels de Castel Rodrigo, to consult with them about several affairs very important to this Kingdom.

From Tangier they confirm to us the report of a Defeat given to Tafalete by the Sante, which if true, may probably occasion great alteration to the affairs of those Countreys, and the concernments of the Garrison, which continues in a good

and flourishing condition. Eruges, Jan. 27. Three of the twelve great ships intended to be let out by the States for the next Summers expedition, are said to be almost persected. De Ruyter continues still at the Hague, in frequent confultation with the States, for the carrying on of the War, but they begin generally to grow very jealous of the growth of the French power and Trade at Sea.
