**THE** Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for paying Half-Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st Day of January to the 30th of June, 1783, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf; These are to give Notice, that the said Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office of the Treasurer of the Navy, in Monday the 22d and Tuesday the 23d, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, viz.
