Hands and Seals of the Commillioners for exccuting the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, in lieu thereof, for their feveral Ships and Veffels, in fuch Manner as by the faid recited Proclamation was directed : And whereas it hath been humbly represented unto Us, that there is the greatest Reason to believe, that many of Our Passes may, either by Accident, or undue Means, have fallen into the Hands of Foreigners, who, by Colour of fuch Paffes, may carry on their Trade; We, taking the Premises into Our Royal Confideration, and judging it necessary to put a fpeedy Stop to all fuch indirect Practices, which do not only tend to the Prejudice of Our Trading Subjects, but may occasion a Mifunderstanding between Us and the Governments on the Coast of Barbary, for preventing thereof, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby declare, That all fuch Paffes of the prefent Form, now in being, shall not continue in Force longer than till the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, (except such Passes have been granted to Ships gone or going to the East Indies, or other remote Voyages, where they cannot be timely furnished with New Passes; and that in such Case, the Passes of the present Form do continue in Force for Two Years, from and after the faid Thirty first Day of Decem ber, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-four). And We do hereby firictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects, who are or shall be posfeffed of any luch Passes, that they do, before the Thirty-first Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-four, return the fame (except fuch as are before excepted) into the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, or to the respective Collectors of Our Cuftoms at the Out-Ports of Great Britain and Ireland, or to the Governors of fome of Our Foreign Plantations or Dominions, in order to their being cancelled; and that they do furnish themselves with Passes of a new Form, under the Hands and Seals of Our Committioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, in lieu therof, for their feveral Ships and Vessels, according to the Treaty subsist-ing between Us and the faid Governments on the Coalt of Barbary, and the Regulations made by Our Royal Predecessor King George the First, by Order in His Privy Council on the Fourteenth Day of June, in the Year One thousand feven hundred and twenty-two, fo far as the fame remain unaltered by the Regulations made by Us in Our Council on the Twenty-eighth Day of August, One thousand feven hundred and feventy-fix, and according to the further Regulations then there made, and Our Instructions given to Our faid Commissioners for exe-cuting the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, touching the fame: And whereas many Ships and Veffels belonging to Our loving Subjects, continue feveral Years trading from Port to Port in the Mediterranean, without returning Home, whereby they cannot fo conveniently pro-cure their Pafies to be exchanged; We do hereby, for the Ease of Our trading Subjects, publish and declare Our Pleasure, That upon the Application of any Owner of any Ship or Veffel, or other lubstantial Merchant, to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, and Oath made by him of the Property of fuch Ship or Veffel, and that Three Fourths of the Company are Our Subjects, according to an Act made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of Our Royal Predecession King Charles the Second, (intisuled, "An Act for encouraging and encreasing of

" Shipping and Navigation,") or fuch other Proportion as may be authorized by Act of Parliament, and upon entering into a Bond for the Return of fuch Pass at the End of Three Years, or of the Voyage, if that shall sooner determine, it shall and may be lawful for Our Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, for the Time being, and they are refpectively empowered to make out a New Pafs for fuch Ship or Veffel, and fend the fame to fuch of Our Confuls in the Mediterranean as the faid Owner or Merchant shall defire, with Direction to fuch Conful, that, upon Application to him from the Master of the Ship, for which the Pals is made out, and furrendering up his Old Pafs, and entering into a like Bond for the Return of fuch New Pafs, he shall deliver out the faid New Pafs to fuch Mafter, and transmit the Old One, with the Bond, to the Office of the Admiraliy of Great Britain: And in order more effectually to hinder, for the future, any Abuses that may be attempted by Foreigners relating to the New Paffes to be islued as aforefaid ; We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That all fuch New Passes, to be hereafter iffued for any Ships or Veffels whatfoever, belonging to any of Our Subjects, inhabiting the Town and Garrison of Gibraltar, shall be made out in a peculiar Form, different from the Form of the New Passes, to be issued for Ships and Vessels belonging to any other Part of Our Dominions; and that such New Paffes shall be lodged with the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Town and Garrison of Gibraltar, and iffued out only by him, according to the Regulations made by Our faid Royal Predeceffor King George the First, and Ourfelf in Council as aforefaid : And the faid Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief, is hereby charged and required, not to iffue or deliver out any luch Paffes to any Perfons whatfoever, other than fuch as are really Our Subjects, inhabiting in the faid Town and Garrifon of Gibraltar, and firicitly to conform themselves to the Regulations and Instructions made and given as aforefaid : But in regard it sometimes happens, that Ships belonging to Our Subjects of other Parts of Our Dominions, call in at Gibraltar without Paffes, and have Occasion to be furnished therewish; We do. for the further Conveniency of Trade, hereby publish and declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That it shall and may be lawful for Our Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Great Bri-tain and Ireland for the Time being, and they are respectively hereby impowered, to lodge Mediterranean Paffes, of the fame Form with the New Paffes, for Ships and Veffels belonging to any other Part of Our Dominions, in the Hands of Our Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief of the Town and Garrison of Gibraltar, with Directions to him to iffue and deliver out fuch Passes to any of Our Subjects, not being Inhabitants of the faid Town and Garrison of Gibraltar; provided the Perfon or Perfons applying for the fame, do comply with and conform to the feveral Rules and Regulations now in Ufe, and required to be observed by such Our other Subjects, And We do hereby order, That the Commissioners of Our Customs in Great Britain, and the Commiffioners of Our Revenue in Ireland, do cause to be carried into Execution such Parts of the faid Order of Council of the Fourteenth Day of June, One thousand leven hundred and twenty-two, concerning
