**I**MPRESSED with an awful Sense of the Dangers which surround us, feeling for ourselves and our Posterity, we approach your Throne with Sentiments becoming your Majesty's loyal Subjects, at so alarming a Crisis.

Having a most grateful Sense of the constant Solitude your Majesty shews to promote the true Interest and Happiness of all your Subjects, and to preserve inviolate our most excellent Constitution, we pray that you may long reign in Peace, over a free, an happy, and united Nation.
