Coffee, Cocoa-Nuls, Ginger and Pimento, may (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in British Built Ships, owned by His Majetty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the faid Islands, to any Port or Place within the faid United States, upon Payment of the fame Duties on Exportation, and subject to the like Rules. Regulations, Securities and Kestrictions, as the same Articles by Law are or may be subject and liable to, if exported to any British Colony or Plantation in America; and the Bonds and Securities heretofore required to be taken for such Ships carrying such Goods, shall and may be cancelled and discharged, upon the like Certificates as are required by the above recited Act to discharage any Bonds given in Great Britain for the due Landing any other Goods in the said United States of America.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necesfary Directions herein as to them may respectively Steph. Cottrell.
