It was with the utmost Concern and Alarm that we beheld the Attempt made by your late Ministers upon the Charter of a great Commercial Company.

We felt for the Rights of every Chartered Body in the Nation, which, had the Measure passed into a Law, would have been threatened by so fatal a Precedent; a Precedent that would have shaken the Title of every Man in the Kingdom to his Property, at the same Time creating, as far as the great Object of India is concerned, a new executive Power in the State, independent of the established Government. Permit us then, Sire, most sincerely to thank your Majesty for having dismissed from your Councils Ministers who would thus dare to attack at once the Crown and the People.

We beg Leave to express our determined Resolution to support your Majesty in the Exercise of that Prerogative, undeniably intrusted to you by the Constitution of this Country.

The humble Address of the Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, Commissioners of Supply, and Heritors of the County of Caithness.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Freeholders, Justices of the Peace, Commissioners of Supply, and Heritors of the County of Caithness, consider it our Duty upon this critical Occasion to approach the Throne with unfeigned Assurances of our most faithful and constant Attachment to your Majesty's Person and Government.

We are equally concerned and astonished at the audacious Attempts of your Majesty's late Ministers to violate the Faith of Chartered Rights, to destroy the Confidence of Parliamentary Engagements, and to erect a new Fabric of Power hitherto unknown to the free Government of this Country, which, as it tended directly to encroach on the Rights of your Majesty's Crown, might, in its Consequences, prove fatally dangerous to the Safety of our happy Constitution, the Excellence of which appears conspicuous in the seasonable Check given to Measures which justly created an universal Alarm throughout the Nation.

These, Sire, being our Sentiments, it well becomes us, with Gratitude and Thankfulness, to acknowledge your Majesty's paternal Goodness in dismissing from your Councils Men who had by such Means forfeited their Pretensions to the Confidence of your People: And while we testify our hearty Approbation of those who have succeeded them, we cannot at the same Time but admire your Majesty's Wisdom and Magnanimity in firmly maintaining that salutary and constitutional Exertion of your Prerogative, against the obstinate Efforts of a disappointed Faction.

Situated as we are in a remote Corner of the Kingdom, we have, nevertheless, in common with our Fellow Subjects, shared of the Blessings derived from the Mildness of your Majesty's Government, and flowing from your paternal Care and Affection for your People; and we beg Leave to assure your Majesty that we are second to none of them in Point of Loyalty and Attachment to your illustrious Person and Family, and that we shall be ever ready to support the lawful Rights and Prerogatives of our Sovereign to the utmost of our Abilities.
