T H E following Intelligence from the East-Indies, received by His Majesty's Ship Cro-codile, has been transmitted to the Right Honourable Lord Sydney, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Bombay-Caftle, December 30, 1783.

IS Majelty's Ship Crocodile arrived the 26th Inftant frim Barriel Instant from Bengal and Madras. She left Bengal about the Middle of November, but has broaght no Advices from the Governor General and Council. A Letter received by her from the Select Committee at Madras, dated the 4th Inflant, gives an Account of the Progress of Mess. Sadlier and Staunton, and of fome Steps actually taken in the mutual Evacuation of Conquests. The General of Tippoo Saib's Army in the Carnatic was in full March to the Changamah Pafs, accompanied by these Gentlemen; and their Ar-rival is mentioned by Tippoo Saib in his Letters to General Macleod as an Event that will bring with it a Certainty of Peace.

Some Boats with Sepoys having been wrecked near Cannanore, in the late bad Weather upon the Malabar Coaff, and about Two Hundred of them feized and detained by the Biddy, notwithstanding repeated Applications made for their Releafe, both by General Macleod, and the Refident at Tilli cherry; and the Cannanore Government being on all Occasions inimical to the Company, the General, immediately after the Relief of Mangalore, declared his Intention to take Satisfaction for these Injuries. In a Letter received within these few Days, we are advised of the Place being taken, and promised further Pasticulars in a short Time; but in this Letter the General mentions that the Nabob Tippoo Saib had defired him to defift ; and claimed the Biddy as his Ally: The General however affures us that no bad Confequences will enfue.

The separate Treaty with Mhadjee Scindia is rived. The President and Select Committee have arrived. just received a Letter from the Peshwa, in Answer to their's, wherein he expresses his full Acquiescence in

the Treaty, and his Readiness to join with the English in offensive Measures against Tippoo Saib, should he fail in performing the Conditions required from . him.

Bombay Cafile, January 10, 1784.

L ATE last Night Dispatches arrived from Briga-dier General Macleod, dated on board the Ranger Snow, off Mangalore, the 28th and 29th Ultimo.

In the first the General gives a particular Detail of the Capture of Cannanore, and in the fecond ad-vises, in general Terms, that the Negotiations for Peace were going on, and that Tippoo Saib had not refused Permission to re-victual Mangalore, which Service the General was then performing, the Boats being in the River, and the Vessels under Way with the Provisions for Onore.

Conflantinople, April 10. Letters from Smyrna mention that the Plague has again broken out in that Neighbourhood in a Manner really alarming.

Liege, May 1. His Serene Highnels the Prince-Bishop of Liege died Yesterday Asternoon at his Castle of Heck, of a Fit of Apoplexy, in the Sixty-

fifth Year of his Age. Legborn, April 30. The Ship Great Dutchefs of Tufcany has been fortunately recovered in the Port of Cherri, in the Island of Zant, by the Care of the British Conful and his Agent. The Captain's Wife, Mr. William Asley, Mr. Clark, a Jew Passenger, and an English Sailor are all fase. These were the only Perfons left on board with the Pirates when the Captain and the reft of the Crew abandoned the Veffel. The Three Pirates have been executed, by Order of the Venetian Governor.
