HIS Majesty being seated on the Throne, adorned with His Crown and Regal Ornaments, and attended by His Officers of State, (the Lords being in their Robes) commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod to let the Commons know, It is His Majesty's Pleasure, that they attend Him immediately in this House: Who being come,

The Lord Chancellor, having received Directions, said:

My Lords; and Gentlemen,

His Majesty has been pleased to command me to acquaint you, that He will defer declaring the Causes of calling this Parliament till there shall be a Speaker of the House of Commons. And therefore it is His Majesty's Pleasure that you, Gentlemen of the House of Commons, do immediately repair to the Place where the Commons usually sit, and there chuse a fit Person to be your Speaker; and that you present such Person, who shall be so chosen, to His Majesty here, for His Royal Approbation To-morrow, at Two o'Clock.

Then His Majesty was pleased to retire, and the Commons withdrew.
