My Lords, and Gentlemen,

His Majesty has been pleased to command me so acquaint you, that He will defer declaring the Causes of calling this Parliament till there shall be a Speaker of the House of Commons. And therefore it is His Majesty's Pleasure that you, Gentlemen of the House of Commons, do immediately repair to the Place where the Commons usually sit, and there chuse a sit Person to be your Speaker; and that you present such Person, who shall be so chosen, to His Majesty here, for His Royal Approbation To-morrow, at Two o'Clock.

Then His Majesty was pleased to retire, and the
