# From Tuelday May 18, to Saturday May 22, 1784.

Westminster, May 19, 1784. HIS Day the Two Houses of Parlia-ment having again met, His Majetty went in State to the House of Peers, went in State to the Houle of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, pre-fented to His Majefty the Right Honourable Charles Wolfran Conwall, whom they had chofen to be Wolfran Cornwall, whom they had chofen to be their Speaker. And the Lord Chancellor having, by the King's Command, fignified His Majefty's Approbation of their Choice, His Majetty was then pleafed to make the following Most Gracious Speech :

## My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Have the greatest Satisfaction in meeting you in Parliament at this Time, after recurring, in fo important a Moment, to the Senfe of My People. I have a just and confident Reliance, that you are animated with the fame Sentiments of Loyalty, and the fame Attachment to our excellent Confitution, which I have had the Happiness to see fo fully manifested in every Part of the Kingdom. The mannened in every rart of the Kingdom. The happy Effects of fuch a Difposition will, I doubt not, appear in the Temper and Wisdom of your Deliberations, and in the Difpatch of the important Objects of Public Bufinefs which demand your Attention. It will afford Me peculiar Pleasure to find that the Exercise of the Power, entrusted to Me by the Conflitution, has been productive of Confe-quences fo beneficial to My Subjects, whole Interest and Welfare are always nearest My Heart.

## Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I have ordered the Effimates for the current Year to be laid before you ; and I truft to your Zeal and Affection to make fuch Provisions for their farther Supply, and for the Application of the Sums granted in the last Parliament, as may appear to be neceffary.

I fincerely lament every Addition to the Burthens of My People; but they will, I am perfuaded, feel the Neceffity, after a long and expensive War, of effectually providing for the Maintenance of the National Faith and our Public Credit, fo effential to the Power and Profperity of the State.

# My Lords, and Gentlemen,

The alarming Progress of Frauds in the Revenue, 'accompanied in fo many Inflances with Violence, will not fail on every Account to excite your Attention. I muit, at the fame Time, recommend to your most ferious Confideration to frame fuch Commercial Regulations as may appear immediately neceffary in the prefent Moment. The Affairs of the Eaff India Company form an Object of Deliberation deeply connected with the general Interests of the Country. While you feel a juit Anxiety to provide for the good Government of our Poffetiions in that Part of the World, you will, I truth, never lofe Sight of the Effect which any Measure to be adopted for that Purpole may have on our Conflitution, and our dearest Interests at Home. You will find Me always defirous to concur with you in fuch Measures as may be of lasting Benefit to My People : I have no Wish but to confult their Profperity, by a conftant Attention to every Object of National Concern, by a uniform Adherence to the true Principles of our free Confliction, and by fupporting and maintaining, in their juft Balance, the Rights and Privileges of every Branch of the egislature.

Disapprobation of the late desperate and unconfitutional Attacks that have been made on your Majesty's undoubted Prerogative, which have ob-ftructed the free Exercise of the Powers of Government, and thrown the Country into an alarming Situation; and we fincerely thank your Majefty for. having most graciously been pleased to call a new Parliament, in order to take the Senfe of your People as fpeedily as poffible, and obviate the Michiefs arifing from the unhappy Divisions and Diffractions which have lately fubfifted. And we do affure your Majefty that we will, upon all Occafions, fupport your Majefly in the juft Exercise of those Prerogatives which the Wifdom of the Law has entrulted to your Majefty for the Prefer-vation of our Lives and Properties, and upon the the due and uninterrupted Exercise of which must depend the Bleffings which the People derive from the best of all Forms of Government.

To his Grace Charles Duke of Rutland, Lord Lieutenant General and General Governor of Ireland.

The humble Address of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, in Parliament affembled. May it please your Grace,

E, His Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-jects, the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament affembled, beg Leave before the Conclution of the Seffion, to declare our entire Satisfaction in the early Proofs which your Grace's Administration has manifested of Firmnels and Wifdom; and that the uninterrupted Confistency of Meafures through the whole Courfe of Public Pro-ceedings, confirms us in a well-founded Convic-tion, that your Grace's Mind is greatly fuperior to every partial Influence or Prejudice, and en-tirely devoted to the Public Welfare.

The Acts of this Seffion bear the firangest Tef-timony to the Warmth with which each Branch of the Legislature has been interested in the Profperity of this Kingdom, The Prevention of fu-ture Scarcity, the Extension of Agriculture, the

Zealons to uphold the true Spirit of the Conflitution, we have made it the Object of our Unanimous Refolution to defend it's genuine Liberty against the Attacks of Licentiousness

We have not fuffered to escape our grateful Obfervation the early Anxiety which your Grace manifested to remove every Apprehension of Party Prejudices:or partial Changes in the Councils or Measures of Government. We feel and acknowledge the Benefits arifing from fuch a Principle. We have fludied to fhew a fincere Disposition to tonfirm them by a liberal Imitation ; and we shall be zealous to concur in diffusing throughout every Part of the Kingdom the successful Influence of so happy an Example. Convinced as we are of the Importance to this Kingdom of a fleady and permanent Administration, it is our ardent Wish that His Majefty may long continue your Grace in the Government of Ireland.

An Act for regulating the Corn Trade, promoting Agriculture, and providing a regular and fleady Sup-ply of Corn in this Kingdom; and for granting to His Majefty, His Heirs and Successors, the Duties therein mentioned.

An Act for licenfing Hawkers and Pedlars, and for the Encouragement of English Protestant Schools.

An AEt for continuing and amending An AEt paffed An Act for continuing and amending An Act paffed in the Twenty-fecond Year of His prefent Majefly's Reign, intitled, An Act for the Improvement of the City of Dublin, by making wide and convenient Paf-fages through the fame, and for regulating the Coal Trade thereof; and for other Purpofes. An Act for wefting the Lands of Knockroe, and other Lands in the County of Waterford, in His Ma-jefly, His Heirs and Succeffor; to the Ufes therein ex-pressed, and for other Purpofes.

pressed, and for other Purposes.

An AB for facilitating the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the United States of America, and for furthering the faid Trade and Intercourfe.

An AA for discharging certain Arrears of Quit, Crown, and Gomposition Rents; which have been growing due for Twenty Years last pass, on the Terms and in the Manner therein mentioned.

An Act for the building and creeting a new and convenient Gaol and Marshalsea in the City of Lime

rick; and to enable certain Trustees or Commissioners; therein named, to purchase Ground whereon to creft and build the fame.

An Act for amending an Act for badging fuch Poor as fall be found unable to support themselves by Labour, and other wife providing for them; and for re-flraining fuch as shall be found able to support themfelves by Labour or Industry from begging; and to extend the Provisions thereof.

An Act for extending the Provisions of an Act, paffed in this Kingdom, in the 19th and 20th Years of His Majefly's Reign, intilled, An Ad for Natura-lizing fuch Foreign Merchants, Tradirs, Arificers, Artizans, Manufacturers, Workmen, Seamen, Far-mers, and others, as shall fettle in this Kingdom.

An Act for the Amendment of the Law in Relation to the Salvage of Ships and Goods Aranded, or in

Danger of perifying at Sea. An Ast for continuing and amending feveral Laws relating to His Majesty's Revenue, and for the more effectually preventing of Frauds sherein.

An AA for the Apportionment and more easy Re-covery of Quit-Rents in certain Cases.

An Act for the more effectually punishing fuch Per-fons as shall, by Violence, obstruct the Freedom of Corn Markets and the Corn Trade, or who shall be guilty of other Offences therein mentioned, and for making Satiffaction to the Parties injured.

An All for afcertaining the Qualification of fuch Perforts as fall take out Commifions of the Peace for Counties at large.

An AEI for regulating the Import of Cinamon, Cloves, Mace, and Nutmegs; and for the better collecting the Dáties thereon.

An Alt to previent the permisious Practice of crefting Glafs Houses within the City of Dublin, or a certain Distance thereof:

An AEI to amend the Laws for the Encouragement of planting Timber Trees.

An Act for the Relief of Prifoners charged with Felony, or other Grimes; who shall be acquitted, or difcharged by Proclamation, respecting their Fees; and

for giving a Recompence for fuch Fers. An AA for the Protection and Improvement of the Inland Fisheries of this Kingdom.

An ASt to further amend and explain an ASt made in the v2th Year of His prefent Majefly's Reign, inti-tled, An Ast for the making of narrow Roads through the mountainous unimproved Parts of this Kingdom 5 and also an Ast made in the 17th and 18th Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled, An Act to amend an Act passed in the 13th and 14th Years of His present Majefly's Reign, intitled, An ACI for amending the pub-lic Roads.

An Act to regulate the Affay of Gold, and promote the Manufacture of Gold and Silver Wares in this Kingdom.

An AA for the more effectually amending and re-pairing the Road from the Town of Dundalk in the County of Louth, to Bann Bridge in the County of Down; and for the better fecuring the Debts which are now due to the Creditors of the faid Road.

An ASt for the further promoting the Linen and Hempen Manufastures.

An Act for indemnifying fuch Perfon or Perfons as have acted for the Service of the Publick in advifing or carrying into Execution a Proclamation of the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council of this King-

dom, bearing Date the 27th Day of January, 1784. An Ast for the more effectual Discovery and Pro-fecution of Offenders called Houghers, and for the Support and Maintenance of Soldiers or others, boughed,

maimed and difabled by fuch Offenders. An Act for the buying and felling of Mult by Measure; and for the more effectually preventing the Frauds committed in the buying, felling, and delivering thereof.

An Act for altering, amending, and rendering more effectual the Laws now in being for regulating and managing the public Goals and Prifons throughout this Kingdom.

An Act for the more easy Discovery and effectual Punishment of Buyers and Receivers of Stolen Goods.

An AA for more effectually preventing the counter-feiting the Current Coin of this Kingdom, and the uttering or paying of falle or counterfeit Coin.

Au All for making appropriate Parishes belonging to Archbishops and Bishops perpetual Cures; and the better rick for the County and County of the City of Lime to enable Juch Archbiftops and Biftops to endow and

augment the Endowments of Vitarages and Curacies to augment the indocuments of recuraces and curactes to them respectively appropriate; and to render more ef-fectual the several Alls now in Force to enable the Clergy bawing Cure of Souls to reside upon their respec-tive Benefices, and to build upon their respective Glebe Lands.

An Act for better fecuring the Monies and Effects of the Suitors of the Court of Chancery and the Court of Exchequer, by depositing the same in the National Bank; and to prevent the forging and counterfeiting any Draught, Order, or other Voucher for the Payment or Delivery of such Money or Effects; and for pther Purpofes.

An Ast for the more effectually paving, cleaning and lighting of the Streets of the City of Dublin, and other Places therein mentioned; and for making Sewers and greeting Fountains and Conduits in the faid City for the Ease of the Poor, and other Purposes therein mentioned.

An AE to continue an AE paffed in the 11th and 22th Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefly, inti-suled, An AEt for the further preventing Delays of Justice by Reason of Privilege of Parliament.

An Act for the due accounting for all Money granted for publick Works, Charities and Hospitals therein mentioned; and for ordering a regular Account in fu-ture of all Monies entrufted to the Corporation for carrying on the Inland Navigation, the Truffees of the Linen Manufacture, the Dublin Society, the Corporation for Pawing the Streets of Dublin; and for other Purpofes therein mentioned.

An Act for directing the Application of the Sum of 15,0001. granted by an Act paffed this Selfion of Par-liament, for the Purpose of paying Bounties on the Sale of the following Manufactures of this Kingdom, that is to fay, of Wool, of Wool mixed, of Cotton, of Cotton mixed, Ibread, Kintings, and Manufactures of Iron or Copper.

An Act to Secure the Liberty of the Press, by prewenting the Abuses arising from the Publication of traiterous, seditious, salle and slanderous Libels, by Perfons unknown.

An AE for difabling Philip Lord Viscount Strangford from Sitting in Parliament, or making any Proxy therein; and also from Sitting and Voting on the Trial of any Peer.

An AA for revising and continuing Temporary Statutes.

An Act to remove Doubts and Scruples, with Respect to the Confiruation of an Ast passed in this Kingdom in the 5th Year of His late Majelly King George the Second, intitled, An Ast for reducing the Interest of Money to Six per Cent.

And to Fifteen Private Bills.

His Grace was then pleafed to make the following Speech :

My Lords, and Gentlemen

IN addreffing you for the first Time in Parliament at the Close of the Session, I embrace with Pleafure the Occasion which is afforded me, of returning you my affectionate Acknowledgments for the Cordiality of my Reception and the early Assurances of your Confidence. And I am at the fame Time highly gratified in being authorized to communicate to you the Sentiments of perfect Satisfaction with which His Majesty approves of your Exertions for the Public Welfare.

Gentlemen of the Haufe of Commons, I am happy in obeying His Majefty's Commands to thank you for the Chearfulnefs with which you have made Provision for the Exigencies and Honour of His Government. Let me affure you on my Part, that the Readiness with which you have granted Supplits, flimulates my utmost Attention and Care that they shall be managed with Oeconomy and applied with Prudence.

#### My Lords, and Gentlemen,

You will have much Satisfaction in reflecting, that the various Objects which, in confequence of the acknowledged Independence of the Legislature, were recommended for your Deliberations at the Opening of this Seffion, have been diligently purfued and accomplifhed.

You have wilely given your Sanction to the extraordinary Expedients' which it has been necessary to employ, in order to preferve the Kingdom from

Famine. And I feel great Satisfaction in the Prof-pect, that they will be prevented for the future by the new and judicious Arrangement of your Corn Laws, and the improved Extension of your Agriculture:

I fee with Pleasure the Exertions of an humane and liberal Principle, which has prompted you to give Enconragement to the National Industry, by favourable Regulations and well directed Bounties. I have warmly at Heart the Advancement of your Trade and the Success of all your Manufactures; and I shall not fail either to confider or to represent those Inflances, whereof the peculiar Circumstances of the Empire have hitherto prevented a full In-vestigation, and which shall be found to require a further Adjustment.

The ufeful Regulations proposed to be introduced in the Collection and Management of the Revenue; the Security of private Property, and Extension of National Credit, by depositing in the Bank of Irez land the Money of Suitors in the Courts of Chancery and Exchequer; the Plans for improving the Metropolis, calculated not more for Ornament and Splendour, than for Health and Convenience; your unanimous Determination to defend the Freedom of the Conflitution againfifthe Attacks of Licentiouineis; and your Attention to the Support of charinable In-flitutions, are all unequivocal Teltimonies of your Wildom, Humanity and Juffice.

I have not failed to convey to our Sovereign the Satisfaction you have fo decidedly expressed in the Bleffings of that happy Constitution which you enjoy under His Majesty's auspicious Government. Senfible as you are of these eminent Advantages, it can hardly be necessary for me to defire, that you fir uld, be attentive to impress them on the Mind, of others, over whom your Superiority of Rank and Information must and ought to give you a just and benevolent Influence.
