We feel and acknowledge the Benefits arifing from such a Principle. We have studied to shew a fincere Disposition to confirm them by a liberal Imitation; and we shall be zealous to concur in diffusing throughout every Part of the Kingdom the successful Influence of so happy an Example. Convinced as we are of the Importance to this Kingdom of a steady and permanent Administration, it is our ardent Wish that His Majesty may long continue your Grace in the Government of Ireland.
