

St. James's, June 12.

The King has been pleased to appoint William Hanbury, Esq; to be His Majesty's Agent and Consul in the Circle of Lower Saxony, and the Free Cities of Bremen and Lubeck.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto Benjamin Vaughan, Esq; a Captain in the Royal Artillery, who has from his Infancy been constantly called Marlow, His Royal Licence and Authority for confirming the said Surname of Marlow to the said Benjamin Vaughan, called Marlow, and that he and his Issue may bear the Surname and Arms of Marlow only, (such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office) in Compliance with the Petition of Benjamin Marlow, of Shirley in the Parish of Milbrooke in the County of Southampton, Esq; Rear-Admiral of the White Squadron of His Majesty's Fleet, whose Wife Anne, Daughter of William Morse, of Gosport in the County of Southampton, Gentleman, deceased, was Sister of Hannah, Mother of the said Benjamin Vaughan, called Marlow, by her Husband Nereas Vaughan, late of Gosport aforesaid, Gentleman, deceased; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

Dublin Castle, June 5, 1784.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day, the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Assembly of the Nobility; and other Persons of Distinction, of both Sexes, at the Castle, who appeared in great Splendor, to compliment his Grace the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode, set to Music, was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Grace to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy throughout this City.
