P R E S E N T,
The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in His Privy Council.

WHEREAS George Cullum, of Brandeston, in the County of Suffolk, Yeoman, was, upon the Twenty-second Day of May last, charged, by Information of Two credible Persons upon Oath, by them subscribed, before Ambrose Uvedale, Clerk, One of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County of Suffolk, with having been guilty, upon Sunday the Sixteenth Day of May last, of being, together with other Persons to the Number of Three or more, to wit, about Thirty Persons, most of whom were armed with offensive Weapons, namely, large Bludgeons and Sticks, capped and spiked with Iron; and so armed, being assembled in order to the rescuing and taking away, and to be aiding and assisting in rescuing and taking away, certain uncustomed Goods, after Seizure thereof by the said Informants, being Officers of Excise, and with attacking the said Informants, near Easton in the said County, with the said Bludgeons and Sticks capped and spiked with Iron, and striking and wounding several of them: Which Information was afterwards, by the said Ambrose Uvedale, certified under his Hand and Seal, and returned to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the same before His Majesty in His Privy Council, pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of His late Majesty King George the Second: His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, require and command, that the said George Cullum do surrender himself within Forty Days after the First Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Justice, or one other of His Majesty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, or to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.
