HEREAS by virtue of an Act paffed in the last Session of the late Parliament, for V Continuing, until the Twentieth of this Inftant June, the feveral Powers granted to His Majefty in and by an Act paffed in the Twenty-third Year of His Majefly's Reign, intituled, "An Act for rear of this majely's keight, indicated, indicated,
preventing certain Infruments from being required from Ships belonging to the United States
of America, and to give to His Majelty, for a
limited Time, certain Powers for the better car-" rying on Trade and Commerce between the Sub-" jefts of His Majefty's Dominions and the Inha-bitants of the faid United States," His Majefty was pleased, by His Order in Council bearing Date the 16th of April last, to make divers Regulations for carrying on the Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of His Majefly's Dominions, and the Inhabitants of the United States of America. And whereas by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, the faid latt recited Act, and the Powers thereby granted to His Mnjesty, are further continued until the 1st Day of August, 1784; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that any unmanufactured Goods or Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohi-bited by Law, (except Oil) and any Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Indico, Malts, Yards and Bowsprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thenee into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in British or American Ships, by British Subjects, or by any of the People inhabiting in, and belonging to, the faid United States, or any of them, and may be entered and landed in any Port in this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the like 'Sort of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to, if imported by British Subjects, in British Ships, from any British Island or Plantation in America, and no other, notwithitanding fuch Goods or Mer-chandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law:

And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the fame Drawbacks, Exemptions and Bounties on Merchandizes and Goods exported from Great Britain, into the Territories of the faid United States of America, or any of them, as are or may be allowed by Law, upon the Exportation of the like Goods, or Merchandize to any of the Islands, Plan-rations, of Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Gieat Britain in America.

And His Majely is hereby further pleafed to order, that any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported directly from thence, in Manner abovementioned, and may be landed in this Kingdom; and, upon then Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Dury commonly called the Old Sublidy (except

porter's own Bond for Payment of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, within the Time li-mited by Law, according to the net Weight and Quantity of fuch Tobacco, at the Time it shall be fo landed, with the fame Allowances for the Payment of fuch farther Duties, and under the like Restrictions and Regulations in all other Respects, not altered by this Order, as fuch I obacco is and may be warehoused by virtue of any Act or Acts of l'arliament in Force; but it is His Majelly's Pleafure nevertheleis, that upon the Importation of any fuch Tobacco into the Ports of London, Brittol, Falmouth, Portsmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, until further Order, to enter into Bond for the Payment, as well of the Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, as of all the farther Duties due for fuch Tobacco, but without any Allowance for prompt Payment of the faid Duty, commonly called the Old Subfidy, or any other of the Duties which were formerly payable in ready Money; and that if any Tobacco, which has been or fhall be fo imported, during the Continuance of this Order, from the Territories of the faid United States, into the faid Ports of London, Briftol, Falmouth, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Whitehaven, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, shall be afterwards taken, within the Time limited, out of the Warehoufes wherein the fame shall be fecured under His Majefly's Locks, in Manner herein before directed, at either of the above Ports, to be exported directly from thence, the Bonds which have been or shall be entered into for Payment of the faid Duties, shall be discharged in the Manner directed by the feveral Acts of Parliament in Force.

And in order to facilitate the carrying on Trade and Commerce between the People and Territories belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in the Weft Indies, including in that Delcription the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Islands, and the People and Territories belonging to the faid United States of America, His Majetty is hereby further pleased to order, that Pitch, Tar, Turpen-tine, Hemp and Flax, Masts, Yards and Bowsprits, Staves, Heading, Boards, Timber, Shingles, and all other Species of Lumber; Horfes. Neat Cattle, Sheep. Hogs, Poultry, and all other Species of Live Stock and Live Provifions; Peas, Beans, Po-tatoes, Wheat, Flour, Bread, Bifcuit, Rice, Oats, Barley, and all other Species of Grain, being the Growth or Production of any of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported by British Subjects, in British Built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any Port of the faid United States of America, to any of His Majefly's Wert India Islands, the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somers Iflands; and that Rum, Sugar, Melasses, Coffee, Cocoa-Nuts, Ginger and Pimento, may (until further Order) be exported by British Subjects, in British Built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the faid Islands, to any Port or Place within the faid United States, upon Payment of the fame Du-ties on Exportation, and fubject to the like Rules, the Dury commonly called the Old Subfidy (except as hereinafter excepted) fuch Tobacco may be ware-houfed under Mis Majefty's Locks, upon the Im-liable to, it experted to any British Colony or Plantation
