PROCLAMATION, A For preventing of Riots and Tumults by diforderly Perfons in the City and County of Edinburgh; and for difcovering, apprehending, and bringing to Justice, the Persons who were concerned in attacking the Diftillery belonging to Meff. Haig and Company at Cannonmills, and in destroying the Distillery at or near the Village of Ford, both in the County of Edinburgh.

HEREAS it has been represented unto W Us, That a great Number of diforderly Perfons in the City of Edinburgh, and Suburbs thereof, affembled themfelves, and, in a riotous and tumultuous Manner, upon the Fourth Day of this initiant June, proceeded to the faid Village of Cannonmills near Edinburgh, where they attacked a Dillillery, Dwelling House, and other Houses, belonging to Meff. James Haig and Company, at that Place, and having forced the Gate of the faid Work, and threatened to burn and deftroy the fame, were with Difficulty prevented from carrying their Threats into Execution; That on the Monday following, a Number of riotous and diforderly Perfons again assembled, and with a Drum beating; and Pite playing, marched to the aforefaid Place, where they made another outrageous and daring Attempt upon the faid Diffillery, and having fer Fire to fome Cafks, attempted therewith to burn certain Outhouses belonging to the faid Mess. James Haig and Company, and actually did set Fire to a Hay Rick, which, with fome Carts and other Implements, were accordingly destroyed: And fur-ther, that upon the Day last mentioned, or foon after, a Number of other Persons, from the Towns of Dalkeith and Musselborough, did in like Manner affemble, and in a riotous and outrageous Man-ner proceed to the faid Village of Ford, where they attacked and deftroyed a confiderable Diftillery there erected, in order to prevent (as they pretended) the Confumption of Corn in the faid Diffilleries, and for other wicked and unlawful Purpofes, by which the Peace of the faid City and County, and the Lives and Properties of Our loving Subjects, are greatly endangered : We therefore, being deeply fensible of the many mischievous Confequences that must inevitably ensue to the Peace of Our Kingdom, and the Lives and Properties of Our · loving Subjects, from fuch wicked and daring Outrages, if they shall go unpunished; and in order to deter all others from committing the like for the future, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby ftrictly charge and command all Magistrates, and other Civil Officers whatfoever, and all other Our Subjects, to be aiding and affitting, to the utmost of their Power, in suppressing fuch illegal and tumultuous Affemblies, and in detecting, apprehending and bringing to Juitice the Perfons concerned in infligating the fame, and guilty of any of the Violences before mentioned: And We do hereby promife and declare, That if any Person or Persons concerned in the aforefaid. outrageous Attack upon the Diffillery at Cannonmills, and forcing the Gate there, or in delivoying the Diffillery at Ford, or fetting Fire, or attempt. ing to fet Fire, to any of the Property belonging to the faid Meff. James Haig and Company, or to the Owner of the Diffillery at Ford, shall, on or before the Twenty-fifth Day of August next, and before

fuch Perfon or Perfons shall be in Custody for the fame, difcover and apprehend, or caufe to be dif-covered and apprehended, any other Perfon or Perfons who hath or have, or fhall have been concerned in any of the faid heinous Offences, fo as he, the, or they, may be convicted thereof, fuch Difcoverer or Difcoverers thall have Our most gracious Pardon for the faid Offences: And, as a further Encouragement to fuch as shall discover the faid Offenders, We do hereby further promife and declare, That any Perfon or Perfons, not in Cuftody as aforefaid, who shall, on or before the faid Twenty-fifth Day of August next, discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any of the Perfons concerned in the aforefaid outrageous Attack upon the Diffillery at Cannonmills, and forcing the Gate there, or in destroying the Distillery at Ford, or in fetting Fire, or attempting to fet Fire, to any of the Property belonging to the faid Meff. James Haig and Company, or to the Owner of the Dif-tillery at Ford, fo as he, fhe, or they, may be con-victed thereof, fhall have and receive, for every Perfon fo difcovered, apprehended, and convicted, the Sum of FIFTY POUNDS Sterling; which faid Sum of Fifty Pounds Sterling, for every fuch Offender fo difcovered and convicted, the Lords Commiffioners of Our Treasfury for the Time being are hereby directed and required to pay, upon the faid Difcovery and Conviction being certified by Our Advocate of Scotland for the Time being, without any further or other Warrant in that Behalf. And laftly, We do hereby frictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects, that they do use their utmost Diligence and Endeavours, in their feveral Places and Stations, to find out, discover, and apprehend, all fuch Offenders as aforefaid, upon Pain of Our highest Displeasure.
