W HE REAS it has pleafed Almighty God in His great Goodnefs to put an End to the late Bloody, Extended, and Expensive War in which We were engaged; We therefore, ador-ing the Divine Goodnefs, and duly confidering that the Great and Publick Bleffings of Peace do call for Publick and Solemn Acknowledgements. have thought fit, by the Advice of Out Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a Ge-neral Thankfgiving to Almighty God, for thefe His Mercies, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, upon Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant July; and We do strictly charge and command, that the faid Publick Thankfgiving be re-verently and decently obferved by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Twenty-ninth Day of this inftant July, as they tender the Fa-vour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may juftly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the Performance of fo religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleafure is therefore, and We charge, that incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, ye pais to the Market Crois of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance : And Our Will and Inat none pretend ignorance: And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caufe printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the fe-veral Shires, Stewarts of Stewarties, and Bailiffe of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom we ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Doubles thereof to the feveral Parocki-Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day impediately preceding the Day above more Day immediately preceding the Day above-men-tioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

AS feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, s contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms; The following Abaratis of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who -may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that shey extend to those who are any ways concerned or inftrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Mamifacturers out of these Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Person shall constact with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and fhall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, er at the Assizes or Quarter-Sessions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS or the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three

Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-ion having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and im-

prifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Perlon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador. &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and fhall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefly's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice ; and if it shall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may band him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Perfon shall refuse to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpose aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Mäjesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George II. Chap. 13.

IF any Berfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indicament at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, .&c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Seotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland ; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Are tificer contracted with, or seduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall fuffer Impriforment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry

Stewaarty, wherein fuch Offender thall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and unfill Portenu be paid : And in Cale of a lublequent Offende of the fame, Kind, the Perions in artist offende thall forfeit, for every Perion cohil steed with or feduced. in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Cuftoms an Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Ma-genty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools ar Utenfils pro-thibited to be exported, as fuch. Officer fiall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to jome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized fhall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the belt Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majelty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who hall feize and fecure the fame,

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penaltics inflicted upon Perfors exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majelly, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly suffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any .Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.
